### TOWN NAMES ON HOUSES TO AID FLIERS KEEPING SENSE OF GEOGRAPHY

CHICAGO, Oct. 20.—Desire of cities to get names of towns painted on roofs resulted in a Cleveland paint company and a Wooster, Ohio, brush factory sending free paint, brushes and laborers to 100 communities within a few days after they offered to render this service to the first 100 cities which applied. Civic organizations in various parts of the country are sponsoring "mark your town" weeks, according to reports.

In Arkansas, Governor Martineau, urged that all cities and towns have their names printed on the Ipswitch, S. D., a bank decorated its roof with letters 10 feet high, while the Pennsylvania railroad systematically marked the roofs of its buildings for the guidance of pilots.

From the air towns look very much alike and unless the pilot is familiar with the route, it is often difficult to identify his location, and appeal to civic pride is resulting in a brisk use of paint and brush for the benefit of aviation.
