AIR MAIL AND PASSENGER SERVICE OPENED BETWEEN MEXICO CITY AND YUCATAN

VERA CRUZ, Nov. 6.—An air mail and passenger service has been inaugurated today between Mexico City and Merida, the capital of Yucatan, by the Mexican Aviation company.

The service will be maintained by Ford child machines of 540 horsepower, capable of carrying four passengers and 200 pounds of mail.

The contract made between the government of Mexico and the concern calls for seven-hour schedule between terminals and includes stops at Vera Cruz, Villahermosa, Ciudad del Carmen and Campeche. The service reduces the present duration of transit by rail and steamer from six to seven days to seven hours. Yucatan and its capital city being without rail connection with other parts of Mexico.

David Guion, referred to in the following article, is a Ballinger boy and no doubt most everyone in Ballinger having a radio will tune in and listen to the program to be presented. Since leaving Ballinger Mr. Guion has become famous by his compositions, especially negro spirituals.

Daisy Polk, soprano, and David Guion, composer and pianist, will be heard from Station WFAA at 9:30 p. m. Friday in a program of negro spirituals and other folk music. In obtaining the services of these two Dallas artists The Dallas News and The Dallas Journal Station has booked the persons "who wrote the book."

No other composer in America has done more for negro spirituals and Southwestern folk music than Mr. Guion with both his arrangements and compositions. It has been said that "What Percy Grainger has done for British and Irish tunes in his superb arrangements, Mr. Guion has done for the American negroes, cowboys and frontiersmen." His published works are too numerous to mention, but among the most famous are "Turkey in the Straw," "Sheep and Goat," "Dance Pichaninny," "De Ole Ark's a-Moverin'," "The Bold Vacquero," "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot," Hopi Indian cradle song, Southern waltzes (a suite of six dances) and "Ho wdy-d-o, Miss

FLOUR BOOTLEGGERS ARE GETTING RICH IN RUSSIA WITH BREAD SCARCE

MOSCOW, Nov. 6.—A professional class of "flour bootleggers" has sprung up in Russia as a result of the shortage of bread. The secret police has temporarily halted its drive against moonshine vodka to put an end to the new menace which threatens to interfere with the government's wheat conservation program.

Every unauthorized person involved in the bootlegging of white flour is subject to arrest, according to a recent governmental decree. The person who sells flour to the bootlegger, the shopkeeper who buys from a bootlegger and the bootlegger himself are hunted

down.
Among the hundreds arrested were six managers of co-operative retail stores who were awarded bonuses for large sales last month. Investigation revealed that they had sold large quantities of white flour to private merchants. The store managers were sentenced to prison terms of from six months to a year. A string of more than 15 merchants who bought the flour and found a ready market for it at 30 cents a pound, were fined 5,000 rubles (\$2,500) each and put in jail for six months.

Legally no white flour is allowed to be sold except on physician's prescription to the effect that a person's health cannot stand a diet of war bread. White flour in Soviet Russia is in the same forbidden category as liquor in

RADIO INSTRUCTION IN THE RURAL SCHOOLS IS NOW CALLED A SUCCESS

HARTFORD, Conn., Nov. 6.—Experiments with radio instruction in the rural schools of Connecticut have been a success. "As long as the programs are designed to supplement the curriculum and are presented in accordance with the principles of pedagogy they are as interesting and instructive, as well as entertaining and can be used by teachers to great advantage." Such is the conclusion of the state's division of rural education after questioning teachers who tried the radio in class rooms.

A music appreciation course began the experiment in this state, and a course of talks on geography, nature studies and books followed. Station WTIC in Hartford broadcast the programs, various citizens in rural communities supplying the receiving sets in the schools.

The most serious drawback to radio in schools, the teachers report, is finding time for programs in prescribed courses that do not permit elasticity.
