# **Flu Prevention**

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 14.—The simplest of home remedies can check the spread of influenza, now invading the Middle West and your nose and mouth. South after sweeping the Pacific coast, according to Dr. George Parrish, in charge of the Los Angeles Health Department.

Dr. Parrish was health commissioner of Portland Ore., during the influenza epidemic of 1918, and for five years served as health ramissioner in St. Louis.

"Liquid nourishment in the form or milk and eggs every few hours Parrish explained.

A more stringent method of preventing the spread of the disease. Dr. Parrish added, is the formation of a vigilance committee.
