LAREDO, Tex., March 5.-With General Gorestieta, former commander of the federal garrison at Guanajuato, in command of the rebel forces at Monterey, and Colonel Zenon Avila, commanding a force of 2,000 rebels at Rodriguez, about half way between Nuevo Laredo and Monterey, it is possible that Nuevo Laredo soon will be in the hands of the revolutionary forces.

The garrison at Nuevo Laredo, under the command of General Torres, marched out of the city this morning, ostensibly for Villaladama, where a skirmish took place.

The surrender of Nuevo Laredo is expected to be made without bloodshed.
