Milk Route is Started at Angelo

SAN ANGELO, Mar. 7.—The first milk route, transporting the dairy products to a San Angelo market, will be started Friday or Saturday plying between the Wall community and this city, according to Cyril Luker, manager of the board of city development dairy department, who is working on an extensive program in this territory.

The board of city development, a business men's commercial organization, has created a new department to cope with the problems of the dairymen in the trade territory and is attempting to aid the farmers in organizing along lines that will not only increase their income, but will also assist in improving the general small and large dairy herds.

A committee of four men was appointed to accept bids on the milk route and was composed of Ben McGregor, D. Estes, T. C. White and Mr. Luker, acting in an advisory capacity. After thoroughly studying the Wall delivery situation and basing their conclusions on actual figures obtained from the producers, the committee reported that it cost an approximate sum of \$64 daily plus car expenses for Wall dairymen to deliver their products on the San Angelo market.

To start with the dairy route will pick-up 40 10-gallon cans, later to be increased as the demand increases. Elbert E. Bradford, manager of the Snowwhite Creamery of San Angelo attended a meeting in Wall Monday night when producers contracted to deliver their milk over the organized route and told those present that his organization was completing plans for their new plant in San Angelo.

Idol May Prove Asiatics Here Before Whites

(By International News Service)
SEATTLE, Mar. 7.—The University of Washington and the American Museum of National History may excavate a portion of road north of Seattle in an effort to find further data concerning the discovery of an ancient Chinese "Fo Dog" supposedly 700-year-old idol which may be a link in establishing the theory that Asiatics were the first inhabitants of the Pacific Coast.

The "Fo Dog" was uncovered by W. W. Scott of Lake City, while he was engaged in road excavation. It was ploughed up at a depth of seven feet in virgin ground.

Photographs of the idol were sent to the American Museum by Rev. Vincent H. Gowens, lecturer on Oriental studies at the University of Washington. The museum has since identified the talisman as Chinese, possibly dating back as far as 1300 A. D.

The idol has been known from time immemorial as a household god in China. Imaged in stone, it was often placed before dwellings to protect the inmates from evil spirits.

Archaeological experts, though slow to declare themselves, have evinced great interest in the find. If it can be shown that the image is a true relic of ancient Americans, a big step will have been made in establishing the forbears of Northwest Indians, they said.

The theory that the ancient carving may have been buried at a comparatively recent time in a Chinaman's grave would not have supporting evidence, it was pointed out. There was no evidence of bones or a grave having been built, and the depth, seven feet, negatived the grave idea.

At the same time and place, Scott said, an object which appeared to be a Chinese Buddha was turned up but his scraper crushed and pulverized the idol before it could be retrieved.

According to Dr. Gowens, the most striking indication that the find antedates Columbus' advent to America is a tiny inscription on the bottom of the idol. Part of it is the name of an ancestral hall or a guild of mediaeval artisans, he declared. The remainder of the inscription declares the image was made by the descendants of one Kao Chi.

Gowens is anxious to submit the find to Roy Chapman Andrews, noted for his explorations in the Gobi Desert of China and who is expected to return to Seattle as a visitor in the near future.

MISSOURI SHOE MAKERS CLAIM INDUSTRY CENTER

Like a well conducted business organization, Capone took his place at the head of the machine and built it up until today the syndicate handles \$75,000,000 yearly in illicit liquor, vice and gambling privileges.

Friends of O'Banion suspected the Genna Brothers of the slaying. The Gennas were the first "alky" cooks. A short time later Angelo Genna's body was found bullet-riddled. Then men known to have been henchmen of Genna were found dead, shot to death, their bodies deposited in prairies. Mike Genna was killed in a police duel. Of the seven Genna brothers, only one is alive and is reported in Italy. Tony Genna was "taken for a ride."

Henry Spingola, politician and brother-in-law of the Gennas, was shot to death. It appears that the north side gang, then headed by Hymie Weiss, had taken full vengeance for the O'Banion killing.

Hymie Weiss ruled the north side liquor mob for only a few months before west side hoodlums, hiding in a lodging house on North State Street, shot him as he was walking on the sidewalk. His bodyguard, Patrick Murray, was also killed in the gunfire and W. W. O'Brien, famous criminal lawyer, was wounded.

Handsome "Schemer" Ducci took up the reins. He was a famous spender and ruled the north side with loud boasts of his courage and ability with a gun. It was his lot to be killed by a young and impetuous policeman. Picked up in a raid, Ducci was being tak-

en to the detective bureau for questioning. He berated his captors and sneered in their faces. Patrolman Dan Haly, following a bitter quarrel, shot Ducci as he sat in the squad car.

"Eugs" Moran was Ducci's successor—until that hour on a Thursday when machine guns wiped out his followers. Today Moran is in hiding and the remnants of the O'Banion gang, Pete and Frank Gusenberg, are dead. In the months that followed, numerous "small fry" were killed.

Orazio Iropea, the "Scourge" was killed in the heart of west side gangdom. Eddie Bardello fell before machine gun fire.

Assistant State's Attorney William McSwiggan was slain in a west side saloon. Thomas Duffy and James Doherty were killed with him. None of these murders have been solved.

"Big Tim" Murphy was killed for no easily apparent reason. "Tony" Lombardo, bodyguard of Capone, was killed in the heart of the "loop." These murders, too, are unsolved.

Gangsters are dying daily in Chicago. New ones, mushroom-like, spring up in their tracks.

No one man today controls the reputed \$75,000,000 vice, gambling and liquor interest in Chicago. Capone stepped from the field, leaving a giant organization to get along as best it could. His right hand man, Jackie Guzik, went to California with his family while Capone went to his winter estate in Florida.

Their henchmen have gone into the west and north sides and are heading minor groups similar in size to the now extinct Moran gang which comprised about ten men. The Aello brothers are still operating on the west side. Joe Salitis' mighty beer outfit is scattered

in all sections of the city. The Melrose Park band of "alky cooks" was broken up by the federal government. The Peru, Ill. group is under federal indictment.

OIL MEN TO MEET IN SAN ANGELO MARCH 16

The Mid-Continent Royalty Owners Association will convene in San Angelo on March 16 in a very important session. Two hundred land owners in this section of the state and 300 royalty owners have been invited to the meeting together with chamber of commerce secretaries and oil and development committees from a number of towns. Ballinger will send a delegation to the meeting from the directors of the chamber of commerce.

HOYT SMITH REPORTED UNIMPROVED THURSDAY

Hoyt Smith was reported Thursday morning to be in a critical condition and had become worse overnight. Wednesday afternoon he was improved but became worse at about midnight Wednesday and doctors were summoned to his bedside. He is suffering from erysipelas in the right side of his face and Thursday morning the infection was spreading to an extent to cause alarm.

MILES STARTS ON STREET PAVING PROJECT THIS WEEK

David H. Ryan has started paving 10 blocks of streets in Miles this week with concrete. His company has just finished the cement work on Highway No. 30 in Tom Green County and the machinery was moved to Miles for the same class of work.

Miles will give a pavement from the Santa Fe depot to the high school building. A few years ago seven blocks of brick pavement was put down on the principal business streets and the additional 10 blocks is being financed by money that was left from that bond issue.

The survey of the streets has been made with a view of constructing drainage canals to carry the surplus water from the business section of the town.

INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS DECREASE IN NEW YORK

ALBANY N. Y., Mar. 7.—There were 149 workmen killed in New York State's industries during January, as against 169 in December.

NEW ENGLAND STATES IN ROAD BUILDING PROGRAM

CONCORD, N. H., Mar. 7.—New Hampshire and Vermont are planning to spend \$12,000,000 on road improvements.

In New Hampshire, the house appropriation committee endorsed a road bill which would provide for an \$8,000,000 bond issue for the construction and reconstruction of trunk line highways. The bill further provides for the retention of the present four cent tax on gasoline.

An appropriation bill was introduced in the house of representatives in Vermont for an annual appropriation of \$4,050,000 for highway work, of which \$2,250,000 is on federal aid roads.
