THE RESULT OF FIRE

The total fire loss for the first nine months of 1931, according to an estimate by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, was \$340,713,477, as compared with \$348,421,656 during the same period last year.

One can be thankful for small favors and feel some sense of optimism in the improvement. But at the same time it is practically certain that at least 80 per cent of the loss was totally unnecessary-was, in other words, caused by human neglect, carelessness or ignorance. If the last three months of the year result in waste on the same scale, our total 1931 bill will

be well in excess of \$450,000,000. The person who is responsible for a fire is just as much a menace to the community as the person who causes accidents through reckless handling of an automobile. But, as yet, the public has not taken this attitude. It has had only a passive interest in fire waste-regarding it much as a matter of course. It has not realized that fire is an individual problem which can be solved only by individual effort in cooperation with other individuals throughout the entire community.




