



Search for "Lost Mine" Continues

A. L. Parr and George Watkins, of Ballinger, are continuing their search in San Saba county for old mines which they expect to locate and operate some day. They have already picked up old trails and signs as clues that they hope will lead to the old mines or to buried treasures.

Following arrow signs on stones recently they found where they believe pots of money have been dug up and removed within the past year. Mr. Parr has here one of the lids said to have been taken from one of these pots and an old gun barrel driven in the ground as a marker where the money was buried. According to the story told in that section seven planes from a foreign county made a landing in that vicinity last summer, hurriedly unearthed the pots of money and flew away

The Ballinger men have spent many months trying to locate the old Spanish mines in that county and have already found openings to some that were worked many decades ago. At present they have several cars of ore ready to ship taken from holes that will bring from \$12 up per ton. This ore is well infused with silver and it is believed that the mines sought will reveal rich deposits of this valuable ore.

The prospectors will continue working on the clues they have secured and are able to read many of the markers found in the section which they believe should direct them to the richest mines ever discovered in this
