Under the Mexican fruit worm quarantine regulations, the state of Texas is providing for and enforcing a so-called host-free period in Cameron, Hidalgo, and Willacy counties. This is a part of the program for the eradication of the Mexican fruit worm in that area. During the spring and summer no fruits subject to attack by that insect are permitted to ripen within that area. 




