Co-Op celebrates great year

The Friona Farmers Co-Op Gin held its 56th Annual Stockholders meeting Tuesday night at the Friona Jr. High Cafeteria. Board President Mitchell Wiseman welcomed the crowd of approximately 130 and everyone enjoyed a meal catered by Danny's Fins & Hens and specialty cakes with the co-op logo on them.

The mood was upbeat and for good reason since last year's record breaking crop of 36,353 bales set the stage for a good financial year also.

The auditors reported that the gin had earnings of \$984,652 for the year. Also, since the gin has very little outstanding debt, the auditors stated the co-op was in great financial shape. Even better news for the cotton growers was that the gin paid \$765,000 in cash dividends and retired \$135,000 worth of stock. The gin was also able to upgrade the plant in order to speed up the ginning process. Co-Op Manger Duncan Welch

said that he was looking forward to another great year.

Two board members were elected. Incumbent Russell Harkins will return to board and will be joined by Garrett Clark. A special gift was given to the Raymond Hamilton family in his memory. Raymond served on the board for 17 years and was a energetic supporter of the gin. Next, door prizes were given out and the meeting was adjourned.



Mayor's Minutes

A reminder about News Channel 10 broadcasting from Friona on July 27th @ 5:00PM, 6:00PM and 10:00PM for the Summer Celebration Campaign. Friona has participated in past years and have enjoyed this event. It's great timing this year with the Kid's Building Camp occurring at the same time. It will be nice to showcase this event to the panhandle.

On June 22, 2018, the working group established by the Friona City Council met to discuss and draft the Yard Parking Ordinance. This group consists of Mayor Pro Tem Greg Lewellen, Council Member Alan Monroe, City Manager Leander Davila and City Secretary Rosa Mendez. The group drafted the ordinance and developed several recommendations. There will be a public meeting concerning this ordinance. The date and place for the meeting will be set at the city council meeting on July 9th. The date and place will be passed on to the public for those who want to attend.

The City of Friona was awarded the Texas Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in 2017 for the construction of approximately 1900 feet of 10-inch water line for a water distribution system improvement project. The construction will begin at Walnut and Highway 60, go north to 14th street, then go west to Jackson Street. Bids

will be accepted until July 24th. The City Council will award the construction contract at the August 13th meeting.

The 4th of July fireworks display was very good. Thanks to the Chamber of Commerce, Randy Geris, Voluntary Fire Department and an anonymous donor for making this a special event for the community.

The city website will go online beginning July 16. Leander Davila has done a great job installing this website. A big thanks to Emma Rector for her assistance in helping Leander install pictures and organize the website. The website will be a great addition to our city. Please go online and look at the website (www.cityoffriona.com).

The street signs that were missing and/or faded will be replaced or added by Friday, July 13th. The Public Works employees have done a very good job completing this project. The next project for this month will be identifying missing house addresses and identify these houses with visible markings either on the curb mailbox or the house itself.

Volunteer Fire Department responded to nine emergency calls in June. There were six car wrecks, one fire in town, one grass fire outside city limits and one call for a gas meter that was hit. Thanks to all of our volun-

teers for the great job they do serving and protecting our city and community.

Chief Jimenez and the police officers responded to 178 calls in June. There were 56 stops, 21 warnings, 35 citations and 7 arrests. (3-possession of marijuana, 1-assault on family member, 1-manufacture and deliver controlled substance, 1-public intoxication and 1-warrant). The officers drove a total of 2165 miles patrolling and protecting our city. I would like to thank Chief Jimenez and the officers for the great job they are doing. They have been shorthanded and have performed very well. There are plans in place to add more officers once training is completed.

Emergency Medical Service made 46 total runs in June. There were eighteen 911 calls, twenty one transfers and sev-

en ended in a "no transport". Payments collected equaled \$9,769.84 and billing totaled \$46,004.76.

Friona Public Library had 3183 visits in June and average of 152 visits per day and open a total of 21 days. There were 3404 items circulated and 51 new items added to the inventory. The Library had a record month for the Summer Reading Program. There were 80 children participating in the program. The increase in patron visits and items circulated was due to the record number of children participating in the reading program. It's great to see the children getting involved and taking time this summer to do lots of reading. Great job to the Library staff for promoting this program for the children.


Good Grief!





January 7, 1927—Messrs. O.G. Turner and J.W. They will handle John Deere line of tractors and implements and the Willys-Knight and Overland line of cars, including the Whippet.





Why do you do what you do? Do you even know why you do what you do, or are you simply happy to drift along with as little self-examination as possible? Motives are a big deal when it comes to crime, and also when it comes to prayer. Psalm 83 is a prayer of Israel for God's deliverance from her enemies who were seeking to stomp her out. The prayer is urgent, vivid, desperate and clear about the need for God's help, but the final verse reveals the proper motive that should dominate all that we do. In the context of seeking God's deliverance, the Psalmist prays in this final verse, "that they may know that you alone, whose name is the Lord, are the Most High over all the earth." (You might read that again, slowly, and let it sink in.)

This holy motive was that even the enemies

would know who God is, and that He alone is the true God. The prayer was not focused on me, myself, and I, the American dream, or a worldly desire for comfort and ease, but for others to see how amazing God is. Just imagine how such holy motives would transform our world. Nations would no longer strive and clamor with their own agendas, but would seek the agenda of the King of King. Cultures would stop brewing up their own moral malaise and walk in God's good path. In fact, just imagine if your motives were transformed by the supreme motive of living in such a way that others would know how amazing God is. Your anthem would no longer be the old Burger King slogan, "My way, right away," but it would be to know Christ and to make Him known.

Well we are two months in and she is still a ball of energy, and although turned our quiet little world from lap dog to agility champion we are thankful, but had for awhile forgotten what it


was like to have a baby in constant need of care. This is the reality, she is just a puppy. Growing every day, but still a puppy.
