Friona Celebrates Maize Days

The 62nd Annual Maize Days Celebration kept rolling this past week with the crowning of a Homecoming Queen, Friday Night Football, the Dixon Memorial Walk/Run, the Parade, and a meet/eat/greet/raffling good time in the City Park.

During the Friona-Roosevelt pre-game festivities Friday night, Liliana Lozoya was named the 2018 Homecoming Queen. Last year's winner, Jacqueline Legarreta, was there to place the crown. The FHS Marching Band was also on the field in full uniform to assist in the event. They will go to marching contest on October 20th in Amarillo. Even though the bonfire got rained out Thursday night, the Friona Chieftains still lit a fire under the visiting Eagles and took them to the limit 38-0 to remain undefeated for the season.

On Saturday morning the Dixon Memorial Walk/Run was held in challenging cool conditions. The upper 40s and low 50s were a drastic change from the 80-90 degree days we had earlier in the week. The cold weather did not dampen the enthusiasm of the participants and Parmer Paws raised over \$800 to help homeless pets in our community.

The annual Maize Days Parade had 65 entrants that included first responders, pageant contestants, vintage vehicles, reunion attendees, machinery, livestock, sports teams, floats, and Elvis. Jim Bob Jones was the parade announcer and Erika Montana was his assistant.



The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, September 24th at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. All commissioners were present. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas

The Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Approval was also given for the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Auditor Larry Johnston. The Commissioners also reviewed the Treasurer's Report presented by Altha Herington and approved the calculated payroll and disbursement for all county employees and elected officials.

The Commissioners rescheduled the Monday, October 8th meeting to Friday, October 5th since that Monday is the Columbus Day Holiday.

The Court approved action to provide all county employees with flu shots at no cost. For \$20, spouses of county employees can also receive the flu shot.



First, (John 1:1) "In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God." Yes, Jesus is the Word.

Second, (Hebrews 4:12) "For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. Fourth, obedience. (Psalm 119:9) "How can a young person stay pure? By obeying your Word." (James 1:22-25) "But don't just listen to God's Word. You must do what it says. Otherwise, you are only fooling yourselves. For if you listen to the Word and don't obey, it is like glancing at your face in the mirror. You see yourself, walk away, and forget what you look like. But if you look carefully into the perfect law that sets you free, and if you do what it says and don't forget what you heard, then God will bless you for doing it."

Fifth, changing God's Word. (Matthew 15:3, 7-9) "Jesus replied, 'And why do you by your traditions, violate the direct commandments of God?' You hypocrites! Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you, for he wrote 'These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. Their worship is a farce, for they teach man-made ideas as commanded from God."

Sixth, I don't claim to know the Bible; I don't claim to understand it all; but, I do believe 2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." And, I believe Jesus when He said in **Panhandle Parables** Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth will disappear, but My Words will never disappear."

God's Word has changed my life, and because of it, I am a better (not perfect) person. I just can't turn my back on a Jesus who has loved me and done so much to transform me; so, I will keep believing and trusting Him and His Word.

Black-eyed Peas

6-8 servings

½ pound salt pork 1 medium onion, chopped

2 pounds fresh, shelled black-eyed peas or 4 8-ounce pack-

ages frozen black-eyed peas

1 pound fresh okra or 1 8-ounce package frozen okra Salt and pepper, to taste

Slice the pork into 1/4-inch-thick slices, then cut slices into 1/4 -inch-thick strips. In a Dutch oven, cook the salt pork strips slowly in 1/4 cup of water until the water evaporates and the salt park is crisp and slightly browned. Remove the pork strips from the pan. There will be a salty residue and a small amount of pork drippings left in the pan. Add the chopped onion and sauté until soft. Add the black-eyed peas and enough water to barely cover the peas. Cut the okra into ½-inch rounds, discarding stems, and add to the peas. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a simmer. Cook until very tender and season with salt and pepper, to taste.

8-10 servings

Combine in a Dutch oven:

4 cups frozen black-eyed peas

1 large ham hock or ½ pound cubed ham 1 cup onion, chopped

1 cup celery, chopped

2-3 tsp. salt

2 ½ tsp. chili powder ½ tsp. dried basil leaves

1 bay leaf

1 can (16oz) tomatoes, drained and cut into small pieces, reserve juice

Add enough water to slightly cover ingredients. Cook, uncovered over medium heat, stirring occasionally, 25 minutes. Stir in 1 cup uncooked rice. Cover and cook 20 more minutes. Add more water if needed. Uncover last 10 minutes if too juicy. This cookbook says this is served best with















Varsity Football

Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 1.2 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.59/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that has fallen 0.8 cents per gallon versus last week to \$2.83/g, according to GasBuddy.

Including the change locally

during the past week, prices yesterday were 15.3 cents per gallon higher than a year ago and are 1.4 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average is unchanged during the last month and stands 28.8 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"With a muted response from OPEC to President Trump's exhortation via Twitter that OPEC do something to Trump's concern, with sevto reign in high oil prices, we may see energy markets rally as concerns grow that Iran's sanctions effective in November may pose more a challenge to global supply than anticipated," said Patrick DeHaan. head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "Oil prices jumped to fresh highs last night on reaction to the chilly reception
