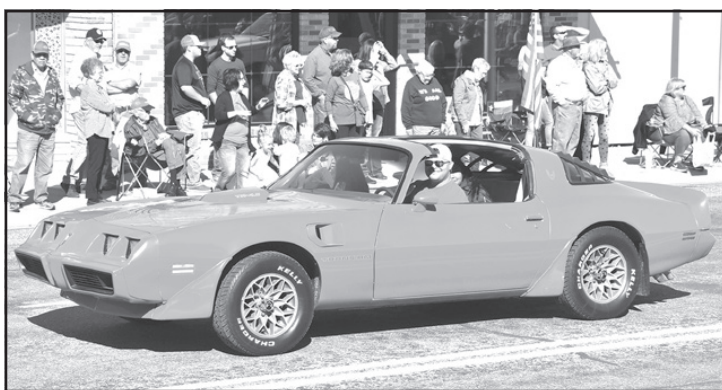

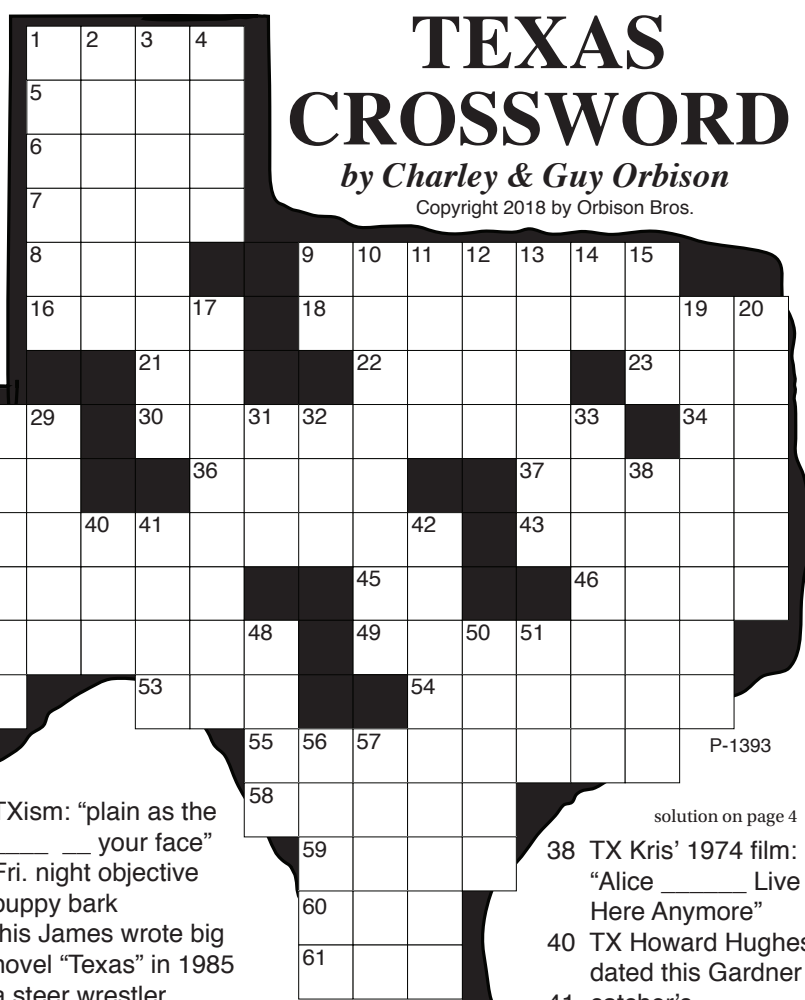

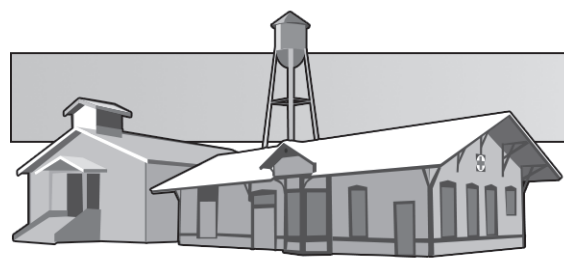

Friona residents were treated Wednesday morning to a spectacular view of a helium research balloon as it floated aloft across the area at heights up to 25 miles.

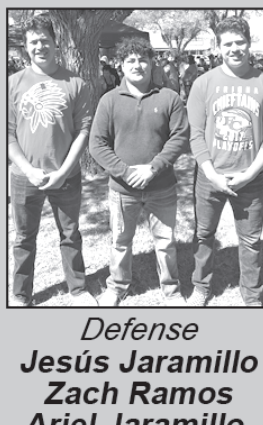
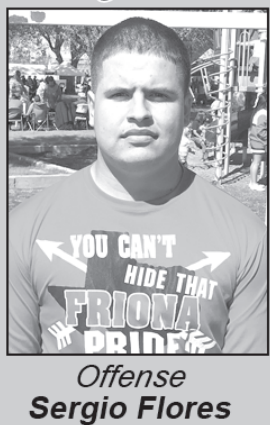
September 29, 1966  
Johnny Mars who farms five miles northeast of Black, marketed the first bale of cotton for the Friona area this week, when the first bale was ginned at Chester Gin on Monday. The bale was actually puled on Saturday, September 24. Field workers pulled 2100 pounds off seven-acre strip. The ginned bale weighed 503 pounds. Mars planted the cotton, Paymaster 101-A the first week in May. Earl Chester, owner of Chester Gin, said he was happy to once again have ginned Friona's first bale of cotton. It marks the eight time in ten years for Chester Gin to process the city's first bale of cotton.

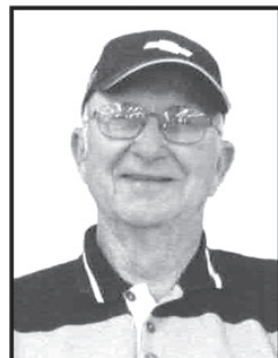

### County Commissioners change next meeting date

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, September 24th at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. All commissioners were present. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas Flag.

The Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Approval was also given for the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Auditor Larry Johnston. The Commissioners also reviewed the Treasurer's Report presented by Altha Herington and approved the calculated payroll and disbursement for all county employees and elected officials.

The Commissioners rescheduled the Monday, October 8th meeting to Friday, October 5th since that Monday is the Columbus Day Holiday.

The Court approved action to provide all county employees with flu shots at no cost. For \$20, spouses of county employees can also receive the flu shot.

Sheriff Randy Geris reported that there are currently 37 inmates in the Law Enforcement Center including some being held for other counties.

First, (John 1:1) "In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God." Yes, Jesus is the Word.

Second, (Hebrews 4:12) "For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires." Whether we agree with God's Word or not, His Word does show us what our innermost thoughts, beliefs, and desires really are! (See 2 Timothy 3:16 below.)

Third, God's Word is truth. (Psalm 119:160) "The very essence of Your words is truth; all Your regulations will stand forever". (Proverbs 12:19) "Truthful words stand the test of time, but lies are soon exposed." God's Word works every single time it is tried!

Fourth, obedience. (Psalm 119:9) "How can a young person stay pure? By obeying your Word." (James 1:22-25) "But don't just listen to God's Word. You must do what it says. Otherwise, you are only fooling yourselves. For if you listen to the Word and don't obey, it is like glancing at your face in the mirror. You see yourself, walk away, and forget what you look like. But if you look carefully into the perfect law that sets you free, and if you do what it says and don't forget what you heard, then God will bless you for doing it."

Fifth, changing God's Word. (Matthew 15:3, 7-9) "Jesus replied, 'And why do you by your traditions, violate the direct commandments of God?' You hypocrites! Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you, for he wrote 'These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. Their worship is a farce, for they teach man-made ideas as commanded from God.'"

Sixth, I don't claim to know the Bible; I don't claim to understand it all; but, I do believe 2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." And, I believe Jesus when He said in Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth will disappear, but My Words will never disappear."

God's Word has changed my life, and because of it, I am a better (not perfect) person. I just can't turn my back on a Jesus who has loved me and done so much to transform me; so, I will keep believing and trusting Him and His Word.

## Psalm 98--Purposeful Praise

# Small Town Cookin'

Along with cooler weather, Fall brings the much-anticipated season of harvest. Whether it is a field of corn or cotton, or a small well-tended garden, harvesting crops is a reward. Earlier this month, I overheard a conversation about harvesting black-eyed peas and it made me curious about this unique vegetable.

- Black-eyed peas are really legumes and the best-known variety of cowpeas.
- They are also known as Southern Peas, crowder peas, and field peas.
- Harvest can begin with the young leaves to make a good green salad.
- Harvest the leaves lightly because the leaves give the plant energy for pod production.
- Green pods appear in 60-70 days.
- These pods are edible and can be eaten like edamame or blanched and frozen for long term storage.
- Mature pods can be harvested for dry storage when they have turned brown and dried. The peas will rattle inside the pods.
- Dry beans can be stored in air tight containers.
- Emptied hulls make a great addition to the compost pile.
- No fertilizer is needed for black-eyed peas. In fact, they are a wonderful soil builder for new beds or marginal soil. <https://healthyeating.sfgate.com/nutrient-black-eyed-peas-2334.html>
- Black-eyed peas offer a balance of healthy protein and carbs as well as fiber and iron.

farmers and this experience left him jaded. He swore he would never eat a black-eyed pea.

However, many love this vegetable. This week's first recipe comes from the Texas Cowboy Cooking cookbook written by Tom Perini. It is a basic way to prepare black-eyed peas. I tried this out last week at a church dinner. I had never had okra in my black-eyed peas, but Lunell Horton told me her mom always cooked her peas with okra. She said it was a "Southern thing." So, to go along with this theme, the second recipe is another Southern tradition, "Hopping John for Company." I found this recipe in the More Calf Fries to Caviar cookbook written by Janel Franklin and Sue Vaughn.

#### Black-eyed Peas

- 6-8 servings
- ½ pound salt pork
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 pounds fresh, shelled black-eyed peas or 4 8-ounce packages frozen black-eyed peas
- 1 pound fresh okra or 1 8-ounce package frozen okra
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Slice the pork into ¼-inch-thick slices, then cut slices into ¼ -inch-thick strips. In a Dutch oven, cook the salt pork strips slowly in ¼ cup of water until the water evaporates and the salt park is crisp and slightly browned. Remove the pork strips from the pan. There will be a salty residue and a small amount of pork drippings left in the pan. Add the chopped onion and sauté until soft. Add the black-eyed peas and enough water to barely cover the peas. Cut the okra into ½-inch rounds, discarding stems, and add to the peas. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a simmer. Cook until very tender and season with salt and pepper, to taste.

#### Hopping John for Company

- 8-10 servings
- Combine in a Dutch oven:
- 4 cups frozen black-eyed peas
- 1 large ham hock or ½ pound cubed ham
- 1 cup onion, chopped
- 1 cup celery, chopped
- 2 - 3 tsp. salt
- 2 ½ tsp. chili powder
- ¼ tsp. dried basil leaves
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 can (16oz) tomatoes, drained and cut into small pieces, reserve juice
- Add enough water to slightly cover ingredients. Cook, uncovered over medium heat, stirring occasionally, 25 minutes. Stir in 1 cup uncooked rice. Cover and cook 20 more minutes. Add more water if needed. Uncover last 10 minutes if too juicy. This cookbook says this is served best with cornbread.
- Full disclosure about the first recipe. I used canned peas. Also, I didn't have salt pork, so I sautéed my onions in bacon grease. I have not tried the second recipe, but thought it sounded good. If anyone tries this one, let me know how it turns out.

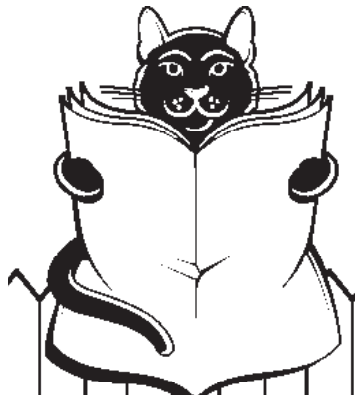

brary projects, such as free ESL classes, the summer reading program, Veteran's breakfast, Friends garden, and scholarships.

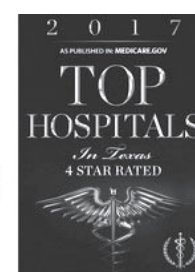

# Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 1.2 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.59/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that has fallen 0.8 cents per gallon versus last week to \$2.83/g, according to GasBuddy.

during the past week, prices yesterday were 15.3 cents per gallon higher than a year ago and are 1.4 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average is unchanged during the last month and stands 28.8 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"With a muted response from OPEC to President Trump's exhortation via Twit-

ter that OPEC do something to reign in high oil prices, we may see energy markets rally as concerns grow that Iran's sanctions effective in November may pose more a challenge to global supply than anticipated," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "Oil prices jumped to fresh highs last night on reaction to the chilly reception

to Trump's concern, with several oil ministers downplaying the rise in oil prices. Moving forward, with Iran's oil essentially out of reach, gas prices may not see the typical decline we had been expecting as recently as the last two weeks as new concerns emerge about the tightrope balance some oil producing countries are hoping for- pushing supply down as global demand rises. That's not going to be good news for motorists."

## Frona-Area Ag Students Aim for \$1,000 AgYouth Scholarships

FFA and 4-H high school seniors in the Friona area are completing their nomination applications for the 4th Annual AgYouth of the Month scholarship program, which has already awarded over \$50,000 in scholarships.

AgTexas Farm Credit Services established the program in 2015 as a way to call positive attention to the outstanding work that high school students are investing themselves in to benefit agriculture, their schools and their communities.

They look forward to joining this past spring's honorees from the Friona area, who were Johnny Ojeda, Seth Ross Murphree, Bryce Bunker and Hadley White (all from Friona FFA), and Hope Herrera, Abbie Hunt, Carley Johnson and Alexis Olmos (all from Farwell FFA).

Of these, Hope Herrera from Farwell FFA and Rori Phillips from Sudan FFA each received a \$1,000 AgYouth Scholarship through a random drawing.

"The purpose of the AgYouth program is to recognize and support Ag youth while building relationships within the communities that we serve," says AgTexas Farm Credit CEO Tim McDonald. He adds, "These students represent some of the best and brightest

minds of the next generation of agriculture in Texas and the United States. It's our privilege to once again pay tribute to their achievements thus far and encourage them for the future."

Students involved in both 4-H and FFA benefit from their organizations' emphasis on leadership development and public speaking, both of which help these emerging leaders grow their confidence and presentation skills.

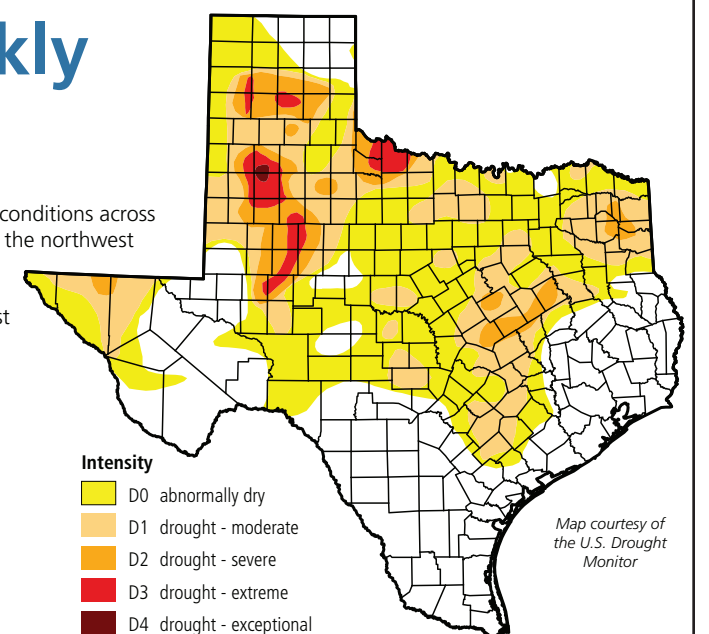
