## County Voters To Elect Sheriff, Commissioners

With a lot of interest in county races for sheriff and two commission spots, Lynn County voters will go to the polls Saturday in the Democratic primary which also will include several contested statewide races. There are 11 voting boxes in the county for the Democratic primary.

Republicans also will have a primary in the county

Saturday, at the city hall in Tahoka, but there are no local candidates on the ballot, so the Democratic nomination winners will automatically be elected in the general voting in November.

Robbie Roberson and Stanley Krause are candidates for the office of sheriff as longtime Sheriff Norvell (Booger) Redwine is not

seeking re-election. A runoff for the Democratic nomination for county commissioner of Precinct 1 is likely, with five candidates seeking the spot now held by Ed Stone, who is not a candidate. Candidates for the job are George Wright, Eldon Gattis, J.L. Hyde, Melvin Edwards and Lawrence Harvick.

There also is a contest for

the Democratic nomination for commissioner of Precinct 3, where incumbent Bart Anderson is opposed by David Massey.

Further confusing the issue on the county commission races is a recent federal court ruling giving new boundaries to Lynn County precincts, but everyone will vote at the same box they have in the past.

Other contested races on the Democratic ballot include the race for railroad commissioner between John Poerner and Buddy Temple; and another railroad commission contest between Jim Hightower and James E. Nugent, and races for court posts. There is a non-binding presidential preference referendum on the Democratic ballot, where voters may mark Jimmy Carter, Edward Kennedy, Jerry Brown or "uncommitted."

Each of the 11 Democratic voting precincts in the county will have a precinct convention at 2 p.m. Saturday, and the county Democratic convention will be at 10 a.m. May 10 in the courthouse.

Republicans also will vote for Ronald Reagan, George Bush or "uncommitted", and will have a contest on one of the nominations for railroad commissioner, where candidates are Hank Grover, Billy Kidd and John T. Henderson. The GOP precinct convention will be at 7 p.m. Saturday at city hall.

In the Democratic Primary all voters in Lynn County will vote at the box where they

are registered even though commission precinct lines were changed by Federal Judge Halbert O. Woodward on April 4.

Election judges in each of the involved voting precincts will determine as voters enter polling places which kind of a ballot each voter shall use. Only four voting boxes are affected by this change. Box 1 in South Tahoka, Box 2 in Wilson, Box 6 in North Tahoka and Box 9 in West Tahoka.

At Box 2 in Wilson and Box 6 in North Tahoka some voters will not be permitted to vote on the race for Commissioner of Precinct 1, because they are no longer in Commissioners Precinct 1. At voting Box 1 in South Tahoka those people living South of South 4th and West of Ave. J will receive a ballot for Commissioners Precinct 3 race as will those people voting at West Tahoka (Box 9) who live south of Highway 380.

All polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. as required by law.

The voting box at New Moore (Box 10) has been reinstated and these people will vote at the New Moore Community Building.

Two changes in polling places should be noted this year. Voting Box 5 at Draw has been moved from the Church to the Paymaster Gin Office and voting Box 6 in North Tahoka has been moved to the Tahoka School Cafeteria at North 3rd and Ave. L. This box has been voting at the Poka-Lambro Building on North Main for several years.

## Two Thefts, Wreck Are Investigated

## Different Drummer For County

The Lynn County Courthouse will close for Memorial Day, but their holiday won't be the same day observed by most businesses in Tahoka and in the county.

Commissioners Monday decided to go ahead with plans to close Friday, May 30,

traditional Memorial Day, while banks and other government offices and many businesses will close on May 26, in accordance with the "Monday holiday" bill passed a few years ago.

The courthouse will be open for business on Monday, May 26.

Filing date for disaster loan applications in Lynn County has been extended as requested by the commissioners, it was noted.

County Judge Melvin Burks reported that the county-wide tax appraisal board will operate without appointing a chief appraiser, and that the board would set up a committee to hear complaints on appraisals and assessments.

Burks also noted that the county will have to pay some attorneys' fees for both sides in the recent federal court case which resulted in a realignment of county com-

missioner precinct boundaries.

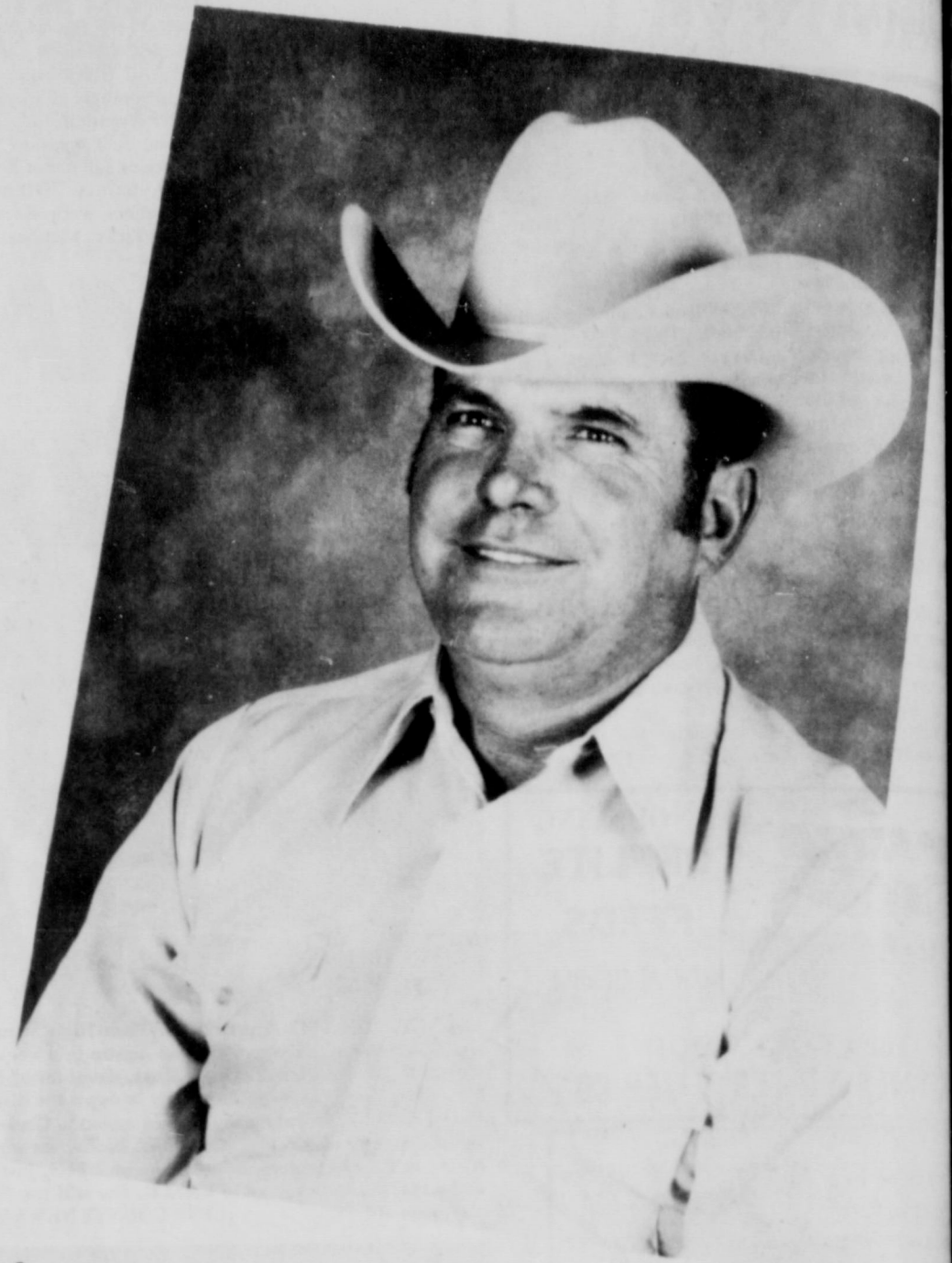

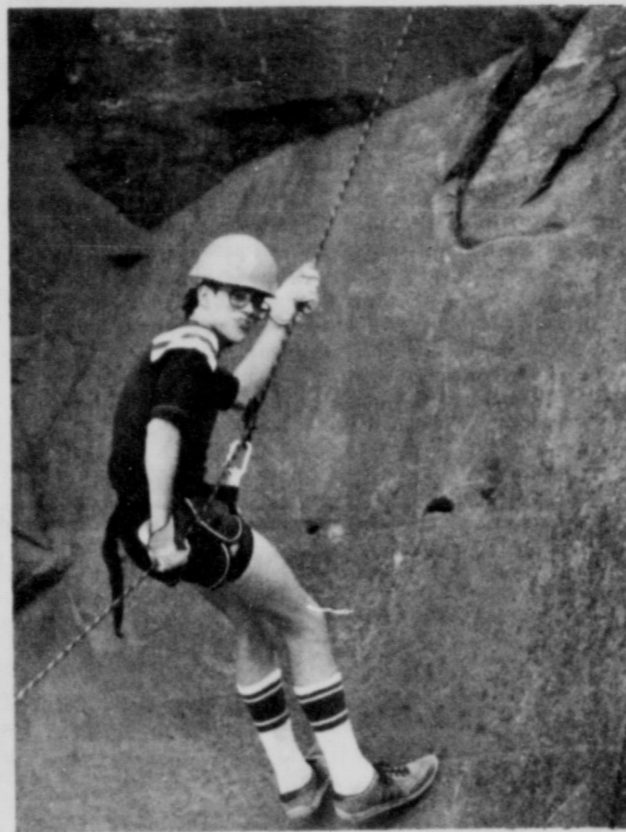

### ACCORDING TO THE BIBLE



BIBLE Answers for BIBLE Questions:  
By DOUG CARTER

QUESTION: What is the purpose of baptism?

ANSWER: (Part 4) So far we have pointed out that the Bible commands us to be baptized to *Obey the Lord*, to be *United with Christ*, and to become a *Child of God*. The word of God also teaches that we are to be baptized in order to be *Born Again*.

When Nicodemus came to Jesus, the Lord told him, "Except one be born anew, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (Jn. 3:3). Nicodemus was a Jew, a citizen of God's kingdom of Israel because of his natural birth; and Jesus told him a "new birth" was necessary to obtain the blessings to be offered by the gospel. Nicodemus was puzzled, "How can a man be born when he is old?" Jesus replied, "Except one be born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (vs. 4, 5). To become a part of the new kingdom, a new birth is necessary - it is a must!

We are told that we are "begotten by the gospel" (1 Cor. 4:15), and that God "begat us with the word of truth" (Jas. 1:18). That word, given by the Holy Spirit (Jn. 14:26; 16:7-13; 1 Cor. 2:11-13; 2 Tim. 3:16), is the "seed" by which we are begotten. But two elements are named by Jesus in this new birth: water and Spirit. Hear Him in Mark 16:16, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." What did He say? "Born of water and the Spirit." It is the same process, described in different words. Paul speaks of it in Romans 6:3,4, "Are ye ignorant that all we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him through baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life." When one is "born of water and the Spirit" he walks in "newness of life." Which is exactly what Paul states occurs when we are baptized into Christ. Until one is led by the teaching of the Spirit to be baptized, he has not been "born again." This "new birth" means that we become a new creature in Christ Jesus, and we will discuss that next week.

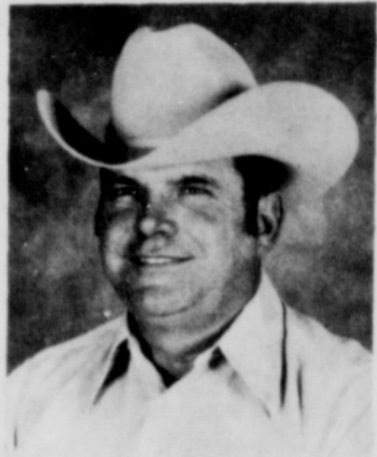

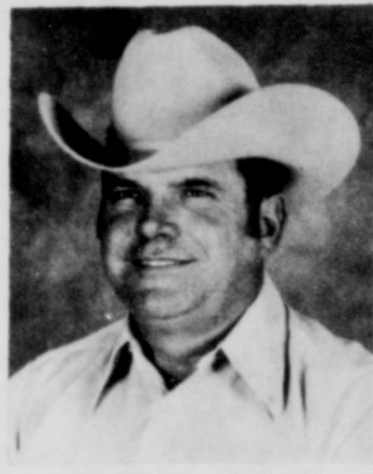
