Prices in Texas on good and desirable wools are better than any indication of prices in the East, and if the wool is to be shipped, the risk ought to be on the dealers.

also that the best previous Vermont public records for ewes is beaten not only 2 pounds 3 ounces by one ewe, but is beaten by seven different ewes. It will be remarked that there is a falling off in the weights attained by ewes and on the other hand, a very good indication that our breeders are becoming convinced that the forcing system to attain large size and heavy fleeces the first year is neither desirable or profitable, and the gains in the mature sheep show that lower development tends much better and larger improvements in the end.

Announcement. It has been deemed best by the officers of the executive board to change the place of holding the next annual session of the Texas Wool Growers' Association from Waco to Austin.

Mutton Markets. The uncertainty attending the outcome of shipments of mutton is very much heightened by the owners of sheep entirely neglecting the precautions they are under obligations to take in the protection of their own interest.

Respecting the statistics of our own country, the United States, we know for a fact they are incorrect, and we proved them so to the satisfaction of the statisticians at Washington who in 1880 only gave us a wool clip of 135 million pounds. This was corrected by us from official sources.

National Wool Growers' Association. A meeting of the above Association is called by the president, Hon. Columbus Delano, to meet at St. Louis, Wednesday, May 27, 1885, at 10 o'clock a.m.

Weekly Clip. The clip is moving. Lamppas is quoting wool from 19 cents down. Sheep raisers are shipping sheep profusely, instead of selecting those fit for market.

George West of Gainesville, came in on Friday with his gripsack full of samples of his wool clip. The latest quotations for wool on the home market is from 17 1/2 cents to 18 1/2 cents per pound.

Receipts lately have been heavy and the market has declined fully 75 cents per hundred since the last report.

There were 64 shorn Texas sheep, averaging 89 pounds, which sold earlier in the week at \$3.90, and 29 head, averaging 88 pounds, at the same price.

There are no very startling features in either the mutton or the wool trade. Business is running along quietly.
