West Texas To See Soybean Increase

"Aword to th wise should be sufficient," says High Plains Research Foundation officials, It is evident that West Teass in 1967 is going to see a considerable increase in acreage planted to soybeans. The big question in every farmer's mind is, "What variety am I going to plant and where am I going to get the seed?"

There are a number of varieties considered acceptable for this area. The variety chosen by an individual will have to depend on his own situation,

en by an individual will have to depend on his own situation, There are five varieties which seem to be best adapted to the West Texas soils and climate, The HINN, HILL, AND LEE varieties are full season varieties with high yield potential, The PATTERSON and CLARK63

varieties are short searon types. There are many farms where the latter will fit into a farmer's planning better than the full-season varieties. Regardless of the variety chosen, one extremely important fact must be taken into consideration. Soybeans are no longer a "step-child crop," If you are going to expect a profitable yield from your 1967 crop, the germination of the seed you planted must be known, Normal recommendations on seedling rate could result in a seedling rate could result in a seed you planted must be known.

to know how much seed will be
necessary for a good stand.
Once more, if you are planning
on a good soybean crop in 1987,
the first rule of success is good
quality planting seed.

FROST FIGHT- If your refrigerator seems to be frosting
up excessively, here are
a couple of things you might
check to improve the situation.
First, carefully examine the
rubber seal around the door.
If the rubber has dried or lost
its resillence, it could be causing an air leak in the door,
It should be replaced. Second
try checking the temperature
control. It it is too low, it
could be causing the freezing
unit to over-ice, A third
thing to watch is leaving foods
uncovered. The mositure in
the food just adds to the frosting
problem.
