With man, no neutral sex has appeared, but both exes cease the work of reproduction at a fixed period of life. This, then, is the most favorable period for work, and, when science has eliminated the infirmities of age, as Prof. Meichnioff believes it is now able, or soon will be able, to do, the aged will be our most vigorous and efficient toilers. Phis is a paradoxical conclusion, and one that will hardly gain the consest of all physiologists.-Success.


