Letter 3rd.

Biggs, Butte, connty, Cal. June, 4, 1904.

Letter 2nd left me at Los Anreles, which is quite a city, as ou doubtless know, and the netropolis for Southern Califoria; her interests are varied, the production of fruit being the eading industry.

There are quite a lot of crude, betrolium pumped from the nuaerous oil wells there, being used argely for fuel. The great outhern Pacific railroad system has largely adopted oil, and are
