Be it enacfed by the LegisTa ture of the State of Texas: SE-TION 1. That Soction 24 o Arlicle III of the Cunstitution the State of Texss be amended as to hereafter read as follows SECTIOL, 24. The members the Legislature shall receive from the Public Tre asury such commay from time to time be provided by law, not to exceed one thousand dollars for each year in which a biennial session of the isions of this Constitution, and five dollars for each day of any Special Sossion held during the suosequent yeur. and in addition thereto, they shall receive mileage in going to and returning from the State Capitol, not to exceed three cents per mile; the distance to be computed by the nearest ler shall prepare and preserve table of distances for each county seat now or hereafter to be estab lished, and by such table the mil eage of each member shall be paic no member shall be entitled to may be called within one day af ter the adjournment of a Regula or Called Session.
Sec. 2. The foregoing Con stitutional Amendment shall b submitted to a vote of the quali fied electors of the State at an e State on the first Tuesday in Au gast, 1907, at which eleotion al votars favoring said proposed a mendment, shall have written printed on their ballots, the words: -'For the amendment to Section tion, relating to the salary of the members of the Legislature," and all those opposed, shall hav the words, "Agsingt the amend. ment to Section 24 of Article III of the Constitution, relating to Legislature.
Sec. 3. The Governor of the State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for same published as required by the Constitution and laws of the State, and the sum of $\$ 1000$ or so much thereof as may be necessey is hereby appropriated out of the general revenue of the State not otherwise appropriated to pay ad election

Joint Resolution to amend Sec 51, Art. 3 of the Constitution of the Stater f Texas, as amended in 1903 , so as to authorize the grant of aid in the establishment and main tenance of a home for the disable and dependent wives and widows of Confederate soldiers andsailors and such women as aided th Confederacy, and making an propration.
Section 1. Be it Resolved by he Legislature of the Sitate of Texas, That Saction 51 of Art. 3 of the Constitution of the 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:
Article3. Section 51. The Legis ature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of puclic money to any individual, associations or individuals municipal or provided, however, the corpoever; provided, however, the Legisla-
ture may grant aid to are may grant aid to indigent nd disablea Chfedorate soldier prior to January 1, 1880, and who are either over sixty years of age Whose disability is the
result of actual service in the Con lederate army for a period oî at least three months, their widows in indigent circumstances who have never been married and who ave been bons fide residents o the State of Texas since March 1,1880 , and who were married to such soldiers anterior to March 1 1880; provided said aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided further, that no $2 p$ propriations shall ever be made specified in excess of five hurdred thousand dollars for hun one year. And also grant aid to the establishment and mainte and sailors a home for siid soldier and sailors, their wives and wi-
dows and women who aided in the Confederacy. under such regula tions limitation as n.ay be provided by law; provided the grant to ard said home shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for any one year, and $n c$ titled to said homes shall be entitled to any other aid from the State, the Legislature may provide for husband and wife to remain togother in the home; and provided further, that the provisions of this section shall not be construed to prevent the grant of ad in case of public calamity
Sec.2. The Governer of the State is hareby directed to issue the necessary proslamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Texas on the first Tuesday in August, 1907.
The sum of $\$ 5000$, or so much thereuf as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to pay the expenses of carrying out the pro-

Proposed Amendment to th State Constitution Prcviding for Districts in Certain Cities.
Joint Reso uxion amending Seation 9, of Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas. providing for the creation of improvement districts in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants, and charging the cost of certain improvements made there in against the abutting property. Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas; That Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution of the State
of Texas, be so amended as to hereafter read as foliows,
SEC. 9. The State tax on pro perty, exclusive of the tax neces ary to pay the public debt, and fit of public fre vided for the benefit of public free schools, shall
never axceed thirty-five cents the one hundred dollars valuation and no counry, city or town shat levy more than twenty-five cents for city or county purposes, and

roads and bridges, and not ex ceeding fifteen cents to pay ju
rors, on the hundred dollars val ustion, except fur payment of debts incurred prior to the adop tion of the amendment Septembe 25, A. D. 1883, and for the erec tion of public buildings, streets sewers, water works and othe permanent improvements, not to exceed twenty-five certs on the one hundred dollars valuation, in any one year, and except 3.8 is in this Constitution otherwise provi; and the Legislature may al d velorize an additional annual ollecterem tar to be levied and collected for the further maintenance of the publio reads; prov:ded, that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the county voting at an election o be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, not to exceed fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars valuation, of the proper. subject to taxation in such ounty. And the Legielature may pass local laws for the mainteance of the public roads and highways, without the local nolaws.
In addition to the foregoing, cities of more than five thousand nhabitants may lay out within their corporate limits, improvement districts in which they, by and with the consent of a major ty of the taxpayers owning rea estate therein, may build sidewalks and charge the cost thereof against the abutting property, and build sewers and pavestreets and charge one-third of the cost thereof against the abutting property on either side of the atreet upon which such improvements are made in such district, and the amount charged against all such abutting property shall bo deemed and held to be a tax against and a lien upon such abutting properts, and the Legislature is required to enaot laws prescribing. the moans for ascertaining the amount properly chargeable against each parcel of abutting property, and providing for the onforcement of its conlection.
SEc. 2. The Governor is hereby direeted to issue the necessary mandion for submitting this mendment to the Constitution to the qualified voters of the State of Texas, on the first Tuesday in August, A. D. 1907, at which eleotion all voters favoring this a-
mendment shall haye written or printed on their ballots, For the amendmant to Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution, permit. ting property owners in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants to oreate improvement dis triets, one-third the cost of which to be charged against abutting property on eitnen side of the street." And the vuters opposed to said amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots the following: "Agsinst the amendment to Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution, permitting: property owners in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants to oreate improvement districts, one third the cost of which to be oharged against abutting proper Sen either side of the straet. SEC. 3. The lateness in the session, the crowded oondition the importance of this proposed amendment, create an emergen:oy and an imperative public ne cessity demanding that the constitutional rule, and Senato Ruls No. 37, requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspendd, and the same are hereby suspended.
