Buffalo Jones is fulfiling his row. He said bo Wednesday on his arrival in Los Angeles. The acts about "new arrivals" related by Jones are nf absorbing interest and of
importanoe to scienca
This "vow" that he is fulfilling is to replace the buffalo by a new animal bread on the old wild stook russed with Galloway or other black domestic stosk. He now ara 100 head of "oattlelo," as he run the wild range in the Buckskin mountains of Arizona. Jones is also breeding othe strange but useful animale. He has developed a species of sheep which, he says, often we:ght 28 pounds at 18 months of age. Tell-
ng sbout yt , the old plainsman said: "Years ago I killet buffaloes by the thoustands. I realized that it was wrong and
made a promise with my conmade a promise with my conscience to do what I oould to restore this noble brute. I am now succeeding better than I ex-
cted.
Buffalo Jones, whose name is J. Jones and whose hume acdress is Jarden City, Kan., is a personal friend of President Roosevelt, and Jones was one of the President's hunting party in the Vellowstone in 1903. Jones is a fearless trapper and hunter and strange as it appaars, seldom uses a rifles. H力 prefers to rope into his cave, if necessary, lariat in hand, and swlftly and unerringly bringing the wild best erringly bringine the wild beast
to death. His skill in roping and to death. His skill in roping and dragging mountain lions out of
high places is a littlo short of miraculous.
This olear-eyed pioneer and piainsman, Buffalo Jones, is now of national interest, because he is officially in charge of the gov ernment breeding range, known 3s the Grand canyon, ini the Buckskin mountains. The tract

This is the home of the new nimal types and here in the remote and inaccessible wilds Buffalo Jones is coming along famously with his now specios sheep and of buffaio outtle, and is meditating on the horse-zebra, musk ox-cow and still other types that are stranger than anytypes ever dreamed of by

Buffilo Jones' success with new sheep, called by him "Persiarino," is attracting attention in all parts of the world. '
is," he says, "the result orosfing Pursian broadtala with large marinos, and the new sheep is nearly twice as large as the parent kind, with very long fleonoe that is cut twieo a year. "This new sheep is very hardy. It will go for sixty days, if foroed, without water. You wonder at this? Not at Bll. Per haps you do not know that they carry on their rumps twenty-fiva to forty pounds of 'surplus,' affording a means of livelihood in in times of stress? In this re-

The new sheep is twice a arge as the original Persian, on both sides, and its fleece weighs the first year $201-2$ phounds.
