



SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6. Yount Resolution to amend Article 11, Sections 4 and 5, of the Constitution of the State, authorizing cities and towns within the State of Texas to be incorporated by special act when the population exceeds five thousand inhabitants.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of

the State of Texas: Section 1. That Article 11, Sections 4 and 5, be amended so that the same shall hereafter read and be as follows: Sec. 4. Cities and towns having a population of five thousand or less may the chartered alone by general law.
They may levy, assess and collect ar annual tax to defray the current expenses of their local government, but such tax shall never exceed for any one year one-fourth of one per cent, and shall be collectible only in current money, and all licenses and occupation of taxes levied and all fines, forfeitures,

it will only be on the market a be authorized by law, but no tax for any purposes shall ever be lawful for any one year which shall exceed two and one half per cent of the tayable and one-half per cent of the taxable property of such city; and no debt shall ever be created by any city or towns unless at the same time pro-vision be made to assess and collect annually a sufficient sum to pay the

annually a sufficient sum to pay the interest thereon and create a sinking fund of at least two per cent thereon Sec. 2. tion of the State of Texas, in regar to the formation and taxing power

of school districts.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:
Section 1. That Section 3 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:

3. One-fourth of the revenue derived from the State occupation taxe and a poll tax of \$1 on every male in habitant of this State between the ages of 21 and 60 years shall be set ages annually for the benealt of the public free school, and in addition thereto there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem State tax of such an amount, not to exceed 20 cents on the \$100 valuation, as with the available school fund arising from all other and support the public free schools of this State for a period of not less than six months in each year, and the Leg islature may also provide for the for mation of school districts by general or special law, without the local notice required in other cases of special legis-lation, and all such school districts whether created by general or specia law, may embrace parts of two or more counties. And the Legislature shall be authorized to pass laws for the assessment and collection of taxes in all said districts and for the man agement and control of the publi school or schools of such districts whether such districts are composed of territory wholly within a county or in parts of two or more counties. And the Legislature may authorize an additional ad valorem tax to be levied and collected within all school districts, heretofore formed or hereafter ormed, for the further maintenance of public free schools, and the erection and equipment of school buildings herein, provided that a majority of the ualified property taxpaying voters of he district, voting at an election to e held for that purpose, shall vot such tax, not to exceed in any one year o cents on the \$100 valuation of the roperty subject to taxation in such district, but the limitation upon the amount of school district tax herein outhorized shall not apply to incorporated cities or towns constituting separate and independent school dis-

Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Validating School Districts and Their Bonded Indebted. Modern Barber Shop ness and Authorizing Levy and Col-lection of Taxes to Pay Such in-

debtedness.
HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5 House Joint Resolution to amend Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas by adding thereto Section 3a, validating school districts and the bonded indebtedness of such dis-tricts and authorizing the levy and collection of taxes to pay such indebtedness.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of

the State of Texas:
Section 1. That Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto a new section, to be known as Section 3a, which shall read and be as follows:

Sec. 3a. Every school district here-tofore formed, whether formed under the general law or by special act, and whether the territory embraced within its boundaries lies wholly within a single county or partly in two or more counties, is hereby declared to be, and from its formation to have been, a valid and lawful district.

All bonds heretfore issued by any such districts which have been ap-proved by the Attorney General and registered by the Comptroller are here-by declared to be, and at the time of their issuance to have been, issued in conformity with the Constitution and laws of this State, and any and all such bonds are hereby in all things validated and declared to be valid and binding obligations upon the district or districts issuing the same.

Each such district is hereby authorized to, and shall, annually levy and collect an ad valorem tax sufficient to pay the interest on all such bonds and to provide a sinking fund sufficient to redeem the same at maturity, not to exceed such a rate as may be provided by law under other provisions of this Constitution. And all trustees hereto fore elected in districts made up from more than one county are hereby de clared to have been duly elected, and shall be and are hereby named as trus-tees of their respective districts, with power to levy the taxes herein author ized until their successor shall be duly elected and qualified as is or may be provided by law.
Sec. 2. That the above and fore

going proposed amendment shall duly published once a week for four weeks commencing at least three months before a special election to be held for the purpose of voting upo such proposed amendment on the first Tuesday in August, 1909, in one week newspaper of each county in the State of Texas in which such a newspape may be published. And the Governor be, and he is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this proposed amendment to the qualified electors for members of the Legislature. At such election all persons favoring such amendment shall have written of printed on their ballots the words "For the amendment to Article 7 of the Constitution validating school districts and school district bonds," and those opposed thereto shall have written o printed on their ballots the words "Against the amendment to Article ? of the Constitution validating school districts and school district bonds."
Sec. 3. That \$5000.00, or as much

thereof as may be necessary be, and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not other wise appropriated, to defray the ex-genses of advertising and holding the election provided for above.
