

Cultivating.

As soon as the young plants are two or three inches high cultivation should commence. Narrow shoveled cultivators with fenders to keep the soil off the plants are used until the plants attain a height of about one foot after which they will grow rapidcultivation as does Indian corn. Many find it adviseable to harrow lengthwize with the rows with a sharptoothed harrow just as the plants are coming up. With a wide harrow and plenty of horse-power this operation is quickly accomplished. Such
