Austin, Texas, May 12 - As-Rowland advises the Cont oller that under the present law "a person's personal and poll taxes becomes a lien on his real estate, other than his homestead and these personal taxes and poll tax owing by him and which constitute a lien against his real estate, should be collected by the County Tax Collector before he undertakes by the issurance of a receipt for the land tax to free such land from the lien existing against it for all such taxes."
