






> There has been eighteen subjects submitted for general Legislation to date as follows:

Appropriation, Re-Districting, Repealing the Automatic Tax Law, Payment of deficiencies. Special appropriation for prosecution of election frauds; prescribing a uniform system of text books; prescribing and fix ing the jtrisdiction of the Su preme Court: reforming and revising Civiland Criminal Codes: creating a State Normal Board of Regents; creating the position of Public Highway an Engineer amending the fire insurance law: an eighteen hour law; Congressional Re-Dictricting; correcting errors in Civil and Criminal Codes; for transfer of process of sale of State lands on Mustang Island to School fund; amendment of the Pure Food Law: amendment to Fish and Game Law; Road Law permitting bonds to be issued on a majority vote.
