

TO THE NO-RESIDENT OWNERS OF LAND IN TERRY COUNTY

Brownfield, Texas, July 10, 1916

The Santa Fe Ry Co. proposes to construct a branch line from Lubbock, south, entering Terry county near the N. E. corner, practically straight through the county, via Brownfield, going out near the S. W. corner. The name of the road and exact location of roadway is not yet determined. They ask only for right-of-way and station grounds free, and are ready to begin work when we can furnish them these requirements. One third of the land in the county is owned by non-residents and situated alternately with local owners.

Resident owners have nearly all signed up, giving right-of-way or a liberal donation. Some owning small tracts are not expected to give it, but will be paid damages, for which we ask and will use donations. The road will enhance values on all alike; we ask donations from all alike.

Home people have pulled for the road, contributed to, and have done other things to upbuild our county, and you are sharing profits from our labor and efforts; we ask you now to help us in this, the biggest thing Terry county ever had offered to her. We need your help, as it isn't the square thing for local people to give right-of way acoss their land and buy it across yours. You can tell by the general route whether it will likely run through your land, and if so, sign for the right of way, and alternately donation; if your land is remote from above route, sign for donation. Local people off the route are giving 3c to 5c per acre on their land.

Please sign and return AT ONCE; we need it soon. If you prefer send it to the Brownfield State Bank of this place. There are no "promoters" or middle men in it. If there is an over subscription it will be prorated back. The undersigned will take care of details and protect donors to the purpose above stated.





Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Relating to Levying Tax for School Purposes. [H. J. R. No. 30.] House Joint Resolution. Proposing an amendment to Section 3, Article 7, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, authorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem county tax not to exceed fifty cents on the one hundred dollar valuation of property for the and authorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem district tax not to exceed one dollar on the maintenance of the public schools of the district.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: Section 1. That Section 3, Article 7 of the

Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to hereafter read as follows:
