HERALD TO ADD A CYLINDER PRESS

Capacity of Present Building to be Almost Doubled, and Moved to Permanent Location South of Bank

In the near future the Herald will add greatly to its present facilities to print a bigger and better Herald, in fact plans are already under way and every thing is being shapped to that end.

In the near future the building which belongs to the plant and which now stands on W. G. Hardin's lot will be moved to its own lot, just south of the Brownfield State Bank, where carpenters will take charge and almost double the present floor space.

In the meantime the editor is negotiating the purchase of a cylinder press that will print four pages of a six column paper much faster than the press we are now using will print one page and when it is installed the Herald will be greatly increased in size and should our merchants want to put on a two, or even four page sale ad, we will be there with the goods

The Herald has always tried to stay up with the size of its town and county, if not in advance, and as the town and county are now growing like wild fire, the Herald not only willingly enlarges its paper and facilities for taking care of its customers, but is actually forced to it. This week our little six page five is so crowded with advertising that we have only very little more than half the amount of reading matter that we want to carry, yet every

thing is condensed and crowded in as small space as possible, and we will have to bear and ask our readers to bear with us until a big press releaves the situation

Already, with six pages press day is a man's job in this office, with our growing circulation, and to add two more pages with our old press is out of the question.

Now, there is a way that our subscribers can be of great help to the Herald right now, as they did before when we put in the old press, and that is by paying up in advance. We now have the whole list in advance as far as that is concerned, but what we mean is that we want them to send in another dollar no matter if you are a few weeks or a few months in advance. To Incorporate

A petition is being circulated this week, and practically all the property owners are signing it, proposing to incorporate the town of Brownfield and its ad-dition, under a comission form of government.

Argument is put forth that we will not be able to grant any franchise to light, power ice concerns, or even pass any substantial sanitary laws unless we do incorporate.

If the commissioners grant the election, and it carries, which is quiet likely, Brownfield will be a city before the railroad gets here, which is doing better than any sister town around here. Lubbock has been incorporated several years, but Tahoka has been less than a year, and all elections in Lamesa so far have failed.
