Of the Terry County Schools to Meet.

This meet, including the following events, will be held at Brownfield, March 30-31.

The following rules have been adopted. (a) Each school in the county is entitled to participate in this meet, but only those schools who are enrolled in the Interscholastic League will be permitted to send representatives to the district meet at Lubbock. (b) The contestants in Essay writing, must send their essays to Prof. Zornes, Tahoka, Texas, not later than March 27th. (c) The exhibits must be sent in before March 31. (d) The pieces for declamation must be selected from some well known author. It must be serious in tone. Poetry funny pieces, dramatic readings and impersonations will not be allowed. The piece must be read within five minutes. (e) The primary reading will be confined to pupils in first, second and third grades, providing the number does not exceed two from each school for each grade. The selection must be read within three minutes. (f) The spelling contest will be based on the words taken from the list issued by the State University. Each school will be allowed a team of not more than three spellers for each contest. (g) The Junior Literary contest, includes all who have not completed the seventh grade. For athletic work, Junior includes anyone under 125 pounds weight. (h) Each contestant must send his name to the director of the event in which he intends to compete, before March 31st.

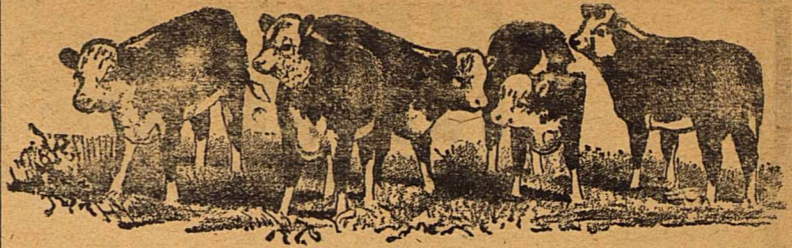

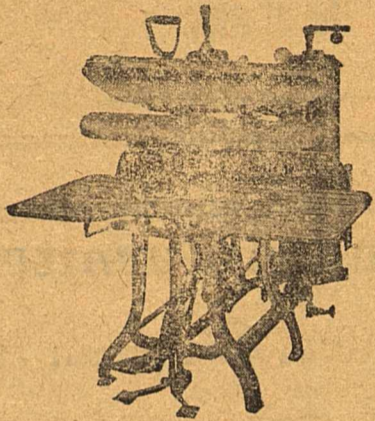

Mr. Poole from the T. F. M. ranch was in town Wednesday.

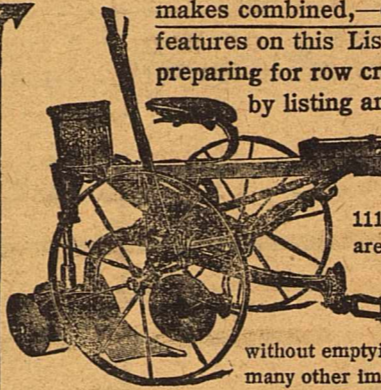
Mr. King from Crosbyton, Tex moved to Charley Moore's place two miles north of town last week.

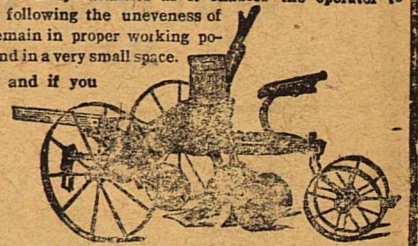
