#### Shall We Issue Road Bonds

The good road proposition is right square up to Brownfield, and what are we going to do about the matter? It seems that Yoakum county is in every way willing to do her part in a good road into New Mexico, and if we aim to hold that trade, we've got to get busy right now.

We understand that the promoters of the Blythe townsite have proposed to be to half the

expense of building a good road to Plains, and into New Mexico, but Plains and Yoakum county want to come here to do their trading, providing we give them good roads, as they already have the foundation of a road in this direction.

Heretofore, it has been mostly the farm class that have opposed the building of good roads, but but it is not so in this county. any time In fact it was through the influence of several of our farmer friends that we are writ-

ing this. Only last week one of the best and most influential farmers in the county asked us to agitate the matter saying that we are now able to get one dollar Federal aid for every one we spend. His idea is to pike our roads with the white dirt to be found in all the draws over the county.

Next Tuesday March 27th, at 2 p. m., a farmer Institute Lecturer will be here and some of the farmers and business men have asked that immediately following this lecture those assembled will go into a good road meeting, and see what the proper thing is to do, and do it right away.

#### The Food Supply

The demand for bread and meat will continue strong. It matters not whether the big war in Europe continues or ends in the near future, none of the vast armies can be demobilized in time for the men to take part in any industry in 1917. In the mean time the million of soldiers and more millions now engaged in the manufacture of war supplies are consumers of bread and meat, produced otherwheres. In the event that the United States enters the war, it thereby becomes another important customer for bread and meat. This will materially increase the already strong demand from abroad. There is every indication that prices of the necessities of life will continue high for the next year.

Northwest Texas is admirably well suited to take advantage of this strong demand of bread and meat. It grows wheat and other small grain successfully. It grows the sorghum grains like kafir and milo. It grows forage like sorghum, sudan. There are vast areas of new fertile land that may be planted to these

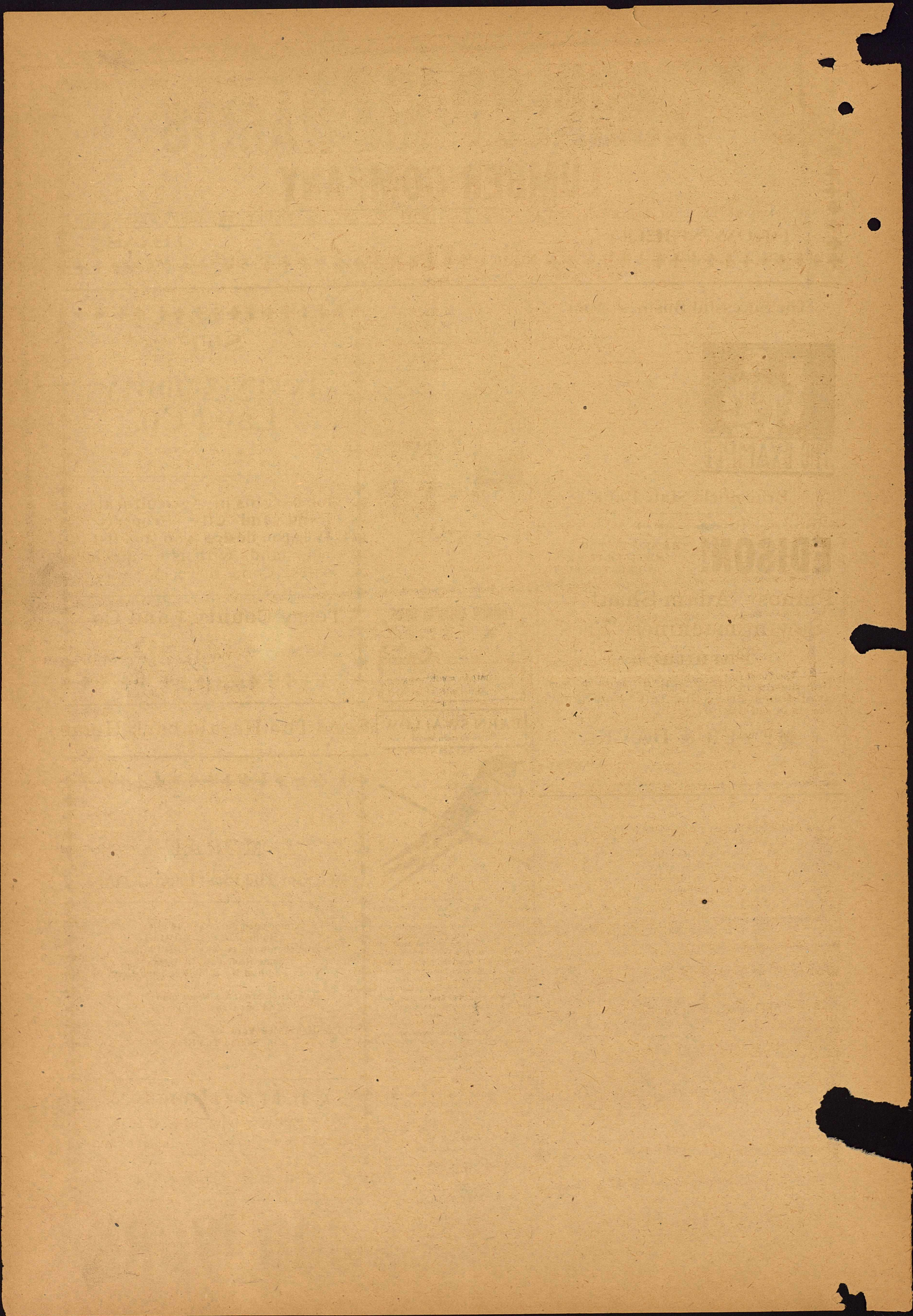

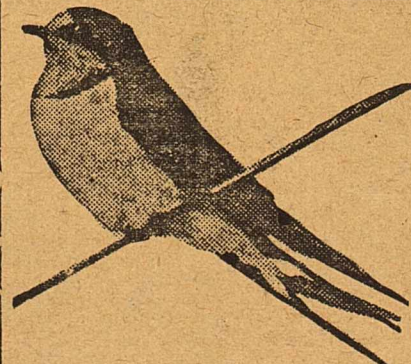

INTERESTING INFORMATION ABOUT THEM SUPPLIED BY THE BUREAU OF BIOLOGICAL SURVEY OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

**BARN SWALLOW**  
(Hirundo erythrogastra)



Length, about seven inches. Distinguished among our swallows by deeply forked tail.

Range: Breeds throughout the United States (except the South Atlantic and Gulf states) and most of Canada; winters in South America.

Habits and economic status: This is one of the most familiar birds of the farm and one of the greatest insect destroyers. From daylight to dark on tireless wings it seeks its prey, and the insects destroyed are countless. Its favorite nesting site is a barn rafter, upon which it sticks its mud basket. Most modern barns are so tightly constructed that swallows cannot gain entrance, and in New England and some other parts of the country barn swallows are much less numerous than formerly. Farmers can easily provide for the entrance and exit of the birds and so add materially to their numbers. It may be well to add that the parasites that sometimes infest the nests of swallows are not the ones the careful housewife dreads, and no fear need be felt of the infestation spreading to the houses. Insects taken on the wing constitute the almost exclusive diet of the barn swallow. More than one-third of the whole consists of flies, including unfortunately some useful parasitic species. Beetles stand next in order and consist of a few weevils and many of the small dung beetles of the May beetle family that swarm over the pastures in the late afternoon. Ants amount to more than one-fifth of the whole food, while wasps and bees are well represented.

### Regarding the Midland Railroad

There is much newspaper talk now to the effect that the Santa Fe may purchase the the Midland and Northwestern now in process of being promoted out of Midland. Regarding the deal, the Andrews Times gives these conclusions.

"That the Santa Fe system is contemplating the purchase of the Midland and Northwestern interests is no news to us. Seminole folks have also been suspecting such a move. The question of importance now is Will the Santa Fe build the connecting link between the two roads or will they stop at Blythe where they own 200,000 acres of land? 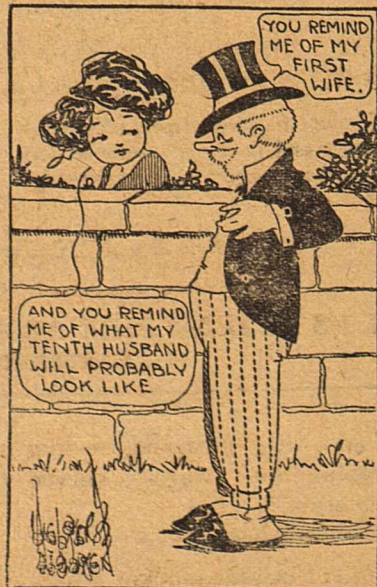

### KEEPING THE COLORS FLYING

Increased Use of Electric Lights for Displaying the United States Flag at Night.

The wave of patriotism which has swept over the country and some recent electrical development has been responsible for some innovations in displaying the colors. In several of the recently erected buildings there are "flood lights" arranged around the base of the flagpole so that at

night, the bunting is to be seen proudly flying just as plainly as in daylight. As a matter of fact, it is much more effective at night, for the flag seems to stand out in the darkness, and the effect is spectacular. Another novelty is an electric flag which has been designed and built by a western electric company and is carried in stock, ready for delivery. This was done in response to a general demand which was created by the example of a Denver doctor who had one of these flags built to his order and placed on a new house which had just been finished for his occupancy. The standardized electric flag as built for general sale is four feet long and contains from 94 to 200 lamps, as desired. It is said that the 94-lamp design may be operated for eight cents an hour.
