





There is much newspaper talk now to the effect that the Santa Fe may purchase the the Midland and Northwestern now in proces of being promoted out of Midland. Regarding the deal, the Andrews Times gives these conclusions.

"That the Santa Fe system is contemplating the purchase of the Midland and Northwestern interests is no news to us. Seminole folks have also been suspecting such a move. The question of importance now is Will the Santa Fe build the connecting link between the two roads or will they stop at Blythe where they own 200,000 acres of land? It is a well known fact that the C. ranch interest now controal the operations of the Midland and Northwestern, and naturally they want the road to extend out of Midland far enough to reach their property. A largepercent of Midland's bonus is payable when trains are operating twenty five miles out of Midland, or to the C ranch With these facts in view we cannot help believing that the Santa Fe will terminate at Blythe and in duce the "privately owned interprise" to terminate at the C ranch. However we hope Seminole will not be left"holding the bag' like Andrews. But indications seem to point to that con clusion.—Slatonite.






