Eighteenth District

The Legislature has at last seen fit to redistrict Texas, after seven years of wrangleing, and puts Terry in the 18th Congressional District, but we will not have a representative for two years or just one year before another census is taken. The new district, while not as large as the 16th or "Jumbo," is composed of the Panhandle proper, is 220 miles wide by 270 miles long and is an empire within itself, and will one day be the wealthiest portion of Texas. Increased Crop Production

"The farmers and live stock growers in this part of the South west never had such a golden opportunity to make money as at present," says Clarence Bell, cashier of the First National Bank of Carlsbad. Mr. Bell is familiar with conditions in this section and has for many years been closely connected with large banking and merchandising interests. The present conditions warrant the farmers in growing much more feed than usual and the stockmen may safely increase their herds and flocks.

"The price of all meat animals increased greatly in 1916. The average price of beef cattle per hundred pounds in 1916 was \$6.46, an increase of 47 cents over 1915. Hogs averaged \$2.20 as against \$6.59 in 1915. Sheep averaged \$6.31, an increase \$1.03 over 1915. Lambs averaged \$8.14, an increase of \$1.34 over 1915. It is safe to say that prices in 1917 will not fall below those of 1916 for finished meat animals.

"The satisfaction of the Agricultural Department for 1916 show only a slight increase in the number of milch and beef cattle and a decrease in hogs and sheep on January 1, 1917. The strong demand and the high price for meat sent more than eleven million head of cattle to market in 1916, thirty million hogs and fourteen million sheep record total for American markets. Since the first of the year there has been a heavy marketing of calves, which will still effect the future meat supply. This condition necessarily interests the farmers and the stockmen of this part of the Southwest.

"A large increase in grain and forage production this season is a most important consideration. More feed is needed to prevent winter shrinkage, which was of no importance in the day of free grass and cheap cattle, but is inexcusable in these days of high prices. And more feed will also make possible the finishing of cattle, sheep and hogs at home and thereby obtain their full value when ready for market.

"In fact 1917 may be the most prosperous season in the history of the Southwest, if the farmers take advantage of the high prices prevailing for the very things that are raised to the best advantage in this section. A. M. Hove
