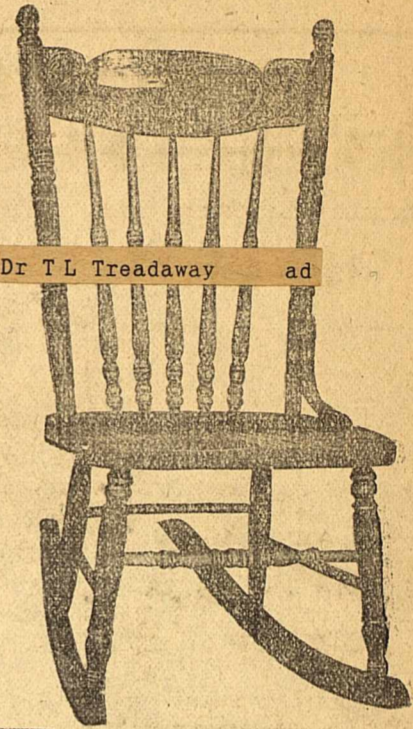
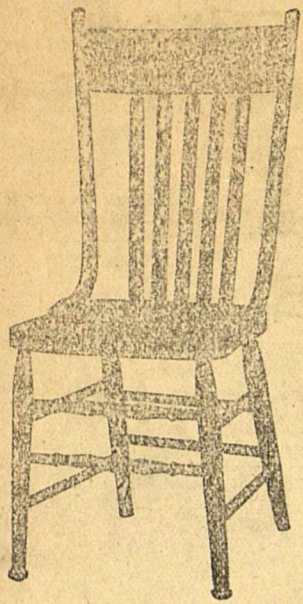

First Twenty-Five Miles Complete.

After many ups and downs and for a long time, apparently most of them downs, the dream of the Midland people is now about to be realized. The first 25 miles of steel have been laid, and the first installment of 25 per cent of the notes, executed by the people of Midland, is now due and payable to the committee who are authorized to collect the same, as per agreement and the condition of the notes.

The benefits that will accrue from the building of this line of railway to the people of Midland cannot be over-estimated. The road will open up some of the finest agricultural country in the State of Texas, underlaid with shallow water that some day will be brought to the surface and used for irrigation purposes, thereby insuring a bountiful crop every year regardless of whether it rains or not, and the supporting of a dense population.

During the stop here, we understand that concrete piers will be put in the bridge over the canyon. The Construction foreman says they will be into Brownfield with steel by the latter part of next week, or at least early week after next.

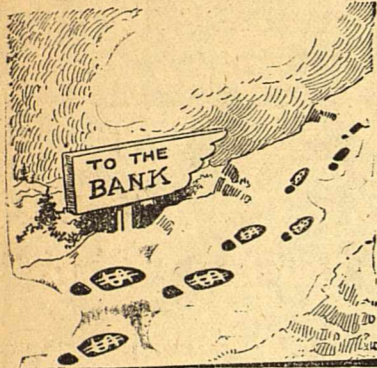

Right now is the time to call a mass meeting to get our big 4th

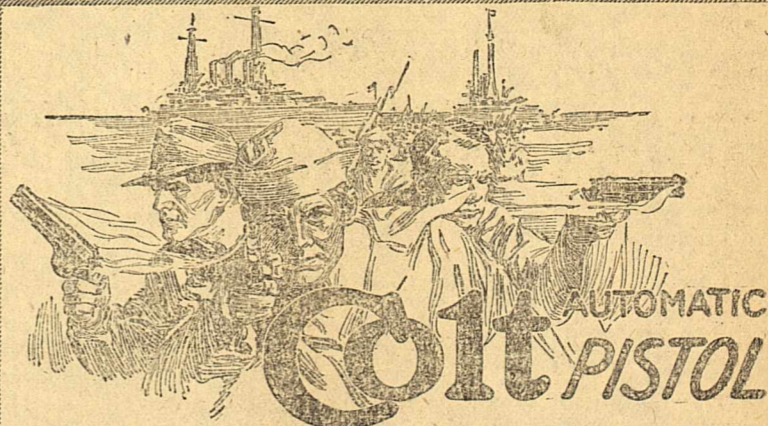

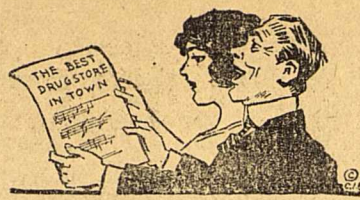

Proposed Amendment

To the State Constitution, Providing for and Relating to the Creation of Conservation Districts. Senate Joint Resolution No. 12.

Proposing an amendment to Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas by adding thereto at the end thereof another section to be known as Section 59, declaring the conservation and preservation of all the natural resources of the State of Texas as public rights and duties; providing for the creation of conservation districts, declaring such districts body politic and corporate, defining the authority of such districts, and conferring upon the Legislature authority to pass laws with reference thereto; declaring that the Legislature shall have authority generally to legislate for the purpose of conserving the natural resources of the State; fixing the time for the election for the adoption or rejection of said proposed constitutional amendment; making certain provisions for said election and the ballots thereof and the methods thereof; directing the issuance of the proclamation therefor, prescribing certain duties of the Governor of the State and making an appropriation to defray the expenses of said election.

Be it recited by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto at the end thereof another section to be known as Section 59, and which shall read as follows:

Section 59a- The conservation and development of all the natural resources of this State including the control, storing, preservation and distribution of its storm and flood waters, the waters of its rivers and streams, for irrigation, power and all other useful purposes, the reclamation and irrigation of its arid, semi-arid and other lands needing irrigation, the reclamation and drainage of its over-flowed lands, and other lands needing drainage, the conservation and development of its forests, water and hydro-electric power, the navigation of its inland and coastal waters, and the preservation and conservation of all such natural resources of the State are each and all hereby declared public rights and duties; and the Legislature shall pass all such laws as may be appropriate thereto.

(b) There may be created within the State of Texas, or the State may be divided into such number of conservation and reclamation districts as may be determined to be essential to the accomplishment of the purpose of this amendment to the constitution, which districts shall be governmental agencies and body politic and corporate with such powers of government and with the authority to exercise such rights, privileges and functions concerning the subject matter of this amendment as may be conferred by law.

(c) The Legislature shall authorize all such indebtedness as may be necessary to provide all improvements and the maintenance thereof requisite to the achievement for the purpose of this amendment, and all such indebtedness may be evidenced by bonds of such conservation and reclamation districts, to be issued under such regulations as may be prescribed by law and shall also, authorize the levy and collection with in such districts of all such taxes, equally distributed, as may be necessary for the payment of the interest and the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of such bonds; and also for the maintenance of such districts and improvements and such indebtedness shall be a lien upon the property assessed for the payment thereof; provided the Legislature shall not authorize the issuance of any bonds or provide for any indebtedness against any reclamation district unless such proposition shall first be submitted to the qualified property taxpaying voters of such district and the proposition adopted.

SEC. 2- The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors for members of the Legislature at an election to be held for such purpose on the third Tuesday in August, A. D. 1917, the same being the 21st day of August, A. D. 1917; at said election the vote shall be by official ballot which shall have printed or written thereon the words "For the amendment to Article 16 of the constitution of the State of Texas providing for conservation districts, the creation of such districts and their government and regulation" and also the words "Against the amendment to Article 16 of the constitution of the State of Texas providing for conservation districts, the creation of such districts and their government and regulation." All voters favoring this proposed constitutional amendment shall erase the words "Against the amendment to Article 16 of the constitution of the state of Texas providing for conservation districts, the creation of such districts and their government and regulation," and those opposing it shall erase the words "For the amendment to Article 16 of the constitution of the State of Texas providing for conservation districts, the creation of such districts and their government and regulation," which said erasures shall be made by making a mark with a pencil or pen through said words. All ballots cast as above provided shall be counted as cast for or against this proposed amendment, and if a majority of the votes cast shall be for the amendment it shall be declared adopted; if a majority of the votes cast shall be against the amendment said amendment shall be lost. All the provisions of the general election laws as amended and in force at the time said election is held shall govern in all respects as to the qualification of electors, the method of holding such election and in all other respects as far as such election laws can be made applicable.

SEC. 3- The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for said election and to have the same published as required by the constitution and laws of this State.

SEC. 4- The sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000 00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated to defray the expenses of such proclamation, publication and election.

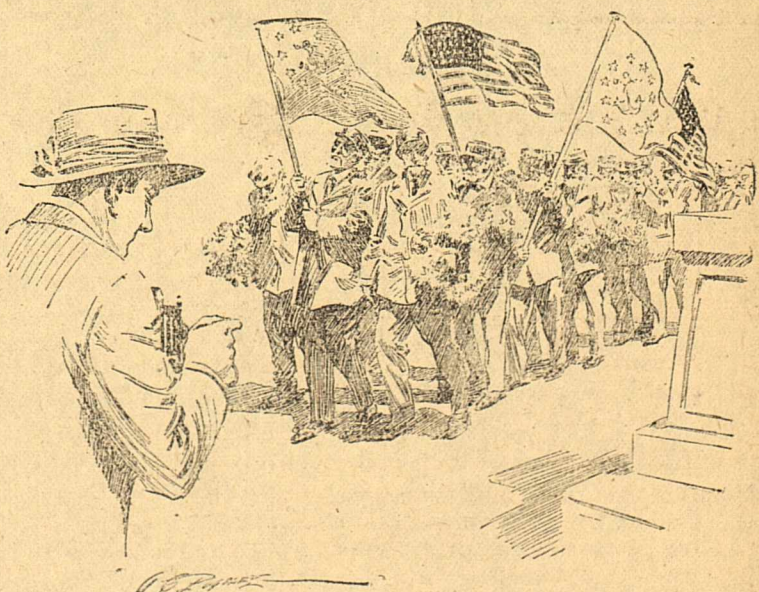

It is lucky that in poultry we can produce the cheapest and most quickly produced meat of all the various sources of our meat supply. It is a well known fact that the available supply of meat products is today the lowest in our country, per capita, in the history of the United States. Let us all join enthusiastically in the propaganda of helping in the probable time of need, by putting forth now every effort to meet, in a measure, the demand that is sure to come for untold quantities of food stuffs. 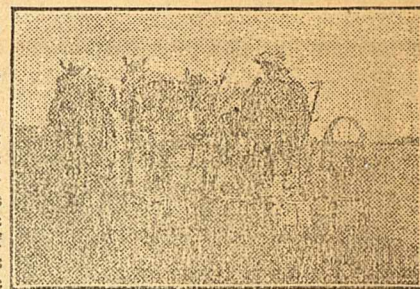

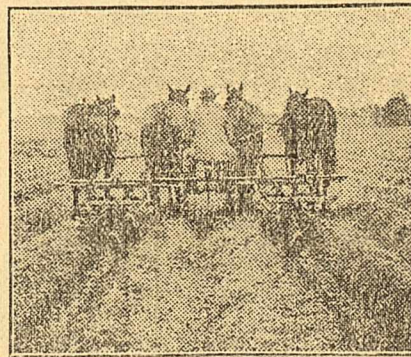

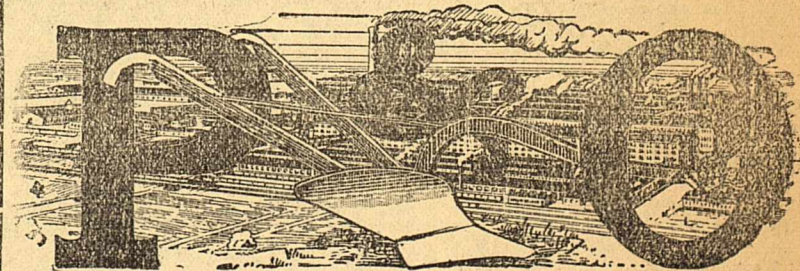

What is a Liberty Bond

A Liberty Loan Bond is a solemn promise of the United State to pay at maturity the amount of the bond to the holder thereof, and to pay interest semi annually each year from date of the issuance of the bond until it is fully and finally paid.

What is the security for a Liberty Loan Bond?

The faith and honor of the United States, backed by all of the resources of the Nation and the American people. A Liberty Loan Bond is a mortgage on all of the resources of the American people.

What is the nature of a Liberty Loan Bond?

There are two kinds of Liberty Loan Bonds. Bearer Bonds are to be issued in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$500, and \$1,000. These Bearer Bonds, which are made payable to bearer, have interest coupons attached which are detached by the holder when the interest installments they represent are due, and can be cashed at any bank the same as a United States Treasury note.

Registered bonds are to be issued, which are to be registered as to both principal and interest due, will be mailed out semi-annually to the holders of these registered bonds.

What are the terms of a Liberty Loan Bond?

Liberty Loan Bonds of the first issue of \$2,000,000 are to bear date of June 15, 1917 and to run for thirty years, except that the Government reserves the right to pay them fifteen years after date. If this right is not exercised by the Government fifteen years from date the bonds will run the full thirty years.

These bonds bear interest at 3 1-2 per cent per annum, and the interest is payable semi-annually on the fifteenth day of Dec. and the fifteenth day of June in each year.

What special advantages have these Liberty Loan Bonds?

One special advantage no other bonds, National, State, municipal, or corporate, have is that if the United States during the continuance of this war shall issue other bonds at a higher rate of interest, the holders of these Liberty bonds have the right to exchange their Liberty bonds for bonds bearing the higher rate of interest, dollar for dollar.

What other special advantages do these Bonds possess?

They are not taxable. If your city, country and State taxes are three mills on the dollar, a not unusual tax, these bonds are equivalent to ordinary corporate bonds or other investments bearing 6 1-2 percent.

In addition, no Federal tax which war conditions may later make necessary will not affect these bonds. The only tax these bonds are subject to is the inheritance tax, which applies to all property of all kinds whatsoever.

How are Liberty Bonds obtained?

Blank forms of application for the purchase of these bonds can be obtained from the Treasury Department, any Federal Reserve Bank, any National, State, or private bank, any express office or any post office in the United States. Any bank or postmaster will aid applicant in filling out his blank and other acts necessary to obtain these bonds.

RIGHT PRECAUTIONS TO USE

In Case of Outbreak of Hog Cholera Everything Should Be Done to Prevent Spread of Disease.

When cholera breaks out on the farm, the dogs should be tied up—the live stock should be shut out of the hog pen, and the wagon wheels should be disinfected so as not to carry the disease from this farm to the neighbors, or even to scatter the germs along the road. The farmer should not leave the infected pig pen without a thorough dipping of his shoes, rubbers or rubber boots in a solution of water and creolin. Lime should be scattered in the buildings which are occupied by the sick pigs.

Every pig or hog that dies should be buried at least four feet deep in the ground or should be burned. A small trench open at both ends and covered with pieces of iron or with a piece of hog fence will make a good oven in which to burn all hogs that die of cholera.

The hog wallow should be eliminated and a hog bath tub made to take its place. Fill it with clean water and put in a small amount of coal tar dip. The pigs can be fed wood or coal ashes with a little sulphur scattered over them.

Value of Sweet Clover.

Sweet clover cut at the proper stage has a high feeding value, resembling alfalfa in this, as it does in appearance. Cattle and sheep do not eat it as readily at the start as is the case with other hay, owing to the peculiar aroma of the plant, but those who have tried it out thoroughly claim that they soon become accustomed to it and eat it as readily as they do clover or alfalfa hay.

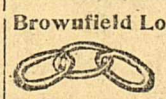

HORSES PIGS and CATTLE

STARTING A FLOCK OF SHEEP

Ram is Main Thing and Conformation Should Be Preferred to Size—Keep Best Ewe Lambs.

(By SMALL ILLINGTON.)
The ram is the main thing. Unless the head of the flock is everything he should be, it will be impossible to breed up to the highest standard.

In selecting the ram, look for conformation, rather than size. Some big rams are poor breeders.

The ram should be close to the ground, square as a block, and strong in bone. He should have a well-shaped head and a clean cut all-around makeup.

If you are near a good, big market for lambs, Southdowns are about the most profitable sheep to raise.

The man who goes into sheep-raising for market, ought to buy a few of the best pure-bred ewes he can afford. Get the best, even if you must



Champion Southdown Ram and Ewe. Limit the number. You can then fill

in with good grade ewes that will not cost much, but which will bring good lambs, if your ram is first class.

Breed the grade ewes to the pure-bred ram and when the lambs are dropped make wethers of the rams and sell them off.

The best of the ewe lambs can be kept and by closely observing the rule of elimination, keeping only the choicest, the flock will quickly improve.

The weeding-out system should be carried into the pure-bred ewes as well, and every lamb that is not up to the mark should be disposed of. Culls, even if pure bred, should go to the block.

Sell the pure-bred rams for breeding purposes, as they will always bring good prices.

Breed the pure-bred ewes when about a year old, and always select the best of their lambs to be added to the flock.

It is interesting work, this breeding up a flock of pure blood sheep, and it pays excellently well for the time and money spent. In fact, there is no other animal which the man of moderate means can raise that will do the farm as much good and bring in as much clean money.

Your sheep must always be well cared for, summer and winter.

Have a place where they can get under cover quickly in the event of sudden storms, which are likely at this season of the year. A structure of this kind should be more than a roof; it should be so deep that the sheep can get far enough under so that the storm cannot possibly reach them. It should also be a hooded shed; that is, some provision should be made for a low front that will break the storm.

If this is not feasible, a good way is to build up a straw stack or stack of cornstalks in the open in front of the open part of the shed, but several feet away so that the sheep will not feel they are penned in, yet can readily get in by going around the stack on the other side.

The floor should be dry at all times, and it is an excellent plan to have more or less roughage which the sheep may munch over to keep them happy and contented.

It is not intended that this shed be more than a place of cover in case of storm. The barn or stable should be the regular home and arranged for comfort.

The subject of marketing is one of the greatest importance and quite another story.

Ideal Place for Sows.

A rye field is an ideal place in which to keep hogs, especially brood sows. Nothing affords such abundance of pasture in the eastern states. It quickly recovers after close cropping and requires but little moisture to keep it growing when sown upon well-prepared ground.

Give All Animals Exercise.

Lack of exercise is bad for all farm animals, but especially so for brood sows. Make them exercise daily, and they will not be so apt to eat their young at farrowing time.

Scientific Explanation.

Prof. E. E. Barnard called attention to the discovery of many dark objects on the photographs taken with the Bruce telescope of the Yerkes observatory, often in regions of the sky where there is no ordinary nebulosity and where the stars are too few to form a luminous background for their relief. The appearance of these objects in black relief on the plates can perhaps be explained on the assumption that space itself possesses a feeble luminosity sufficient to affect the sensitive photographic plate with very long exposures.

TAXI HAS GASOLINE JAG.

And then, while a college of chauffeurs held a clinic, the firemen folded their tarpaulins and silently stole away.

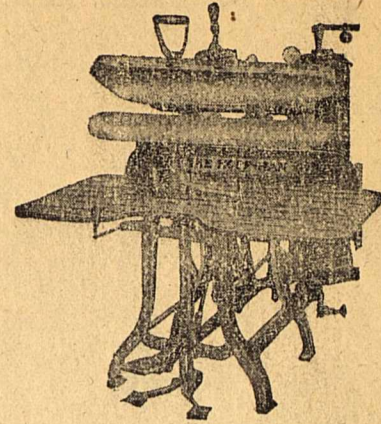
