VEIVET BEANS SOLVE SOUTH＇S FEED PROBLEE
The feed question is being solved in many parts of the south by abundant yields of velvet beans which were sown on a large acreage this year．Owing to the increased acreage in Geor gia，that State alone could take care of 50,000 to 100,000 head of cattle from states where forage is scarce，according to a report
recently received by the Buraeu recently received by the Buraeu of Crop Estimates．Large quan－
tities of lastyears velvet beans al－ $\left\lvert\, \begin{aligned} & \text { tities of lastyears velvet beans al } \\ & \text { so remain on hand and are being }\end{aligned}\right.$ used extensively in feedingdairy cattle．In tests conducted by the United States Department of Agriculture on the Govern－ ment farms at Beltsville，Md．，it was found that velvet beans com Dare favorably with cotton seed meal，producing profitable gains when the beans are the sole con－ centrate of the ration；that a combination of corn silage and velvet beans form a satisfactory ration for fattening steers for $\left\lvert\, \begin{aligned} & \text { ration } \\ & \text { market；that it is more profitable }\end{aligned}\right.$ to feed soaked beans than it is to grind them；and that more
beans will be eaten if soaked be fore they are fed than if they are fed dry．
