## General Description

The No. or Deere Riding Cotton and Corn Planter is a machine that will sweep the top of the bed, plant and cover either in bedded land or surface planting and at the same time allow the operator to ride. The No. $6 \mathbf{r}$ is automatically thrown in and out of gear by the lowering or raising of the machine. With the exception of the tongue, the machine is built entirely of steel. The adjustable sweep standard is built so that any sweep or corn shovel now on the market can be attached. It has a large seed hopper and a small opening is left at the top of the seed spout, enabling the operator to see exactly what work is being done. The covering shovel standards are al equipped with slip joint bolts, avoiding breakage upon striking any obstruc$t^{\text {ion }}$. The equipment includes a strong malleable clevis and special heel bolt and washer on sweep shank. The machine is simple in its construction, is strongly built, and is devoid of all complicated mechanism, making first-class work possible for anyone, without previous experience with farm tools. With ordinary care the tool should last a lifetime.

A great many pinners announce that hereafter they will not make the reports to the government agents as to the number of bales of cotton they have ginned, as they believed such reports operate to reduce the price of cotton.
The labor troublea in Rusaia have reached a point amounting to insurrection against the government. Thousands of factory hands, railroad workers, printers and other laborers have joined io the strike for shorter work bours, the legal working day in Russia being eleven hours. Last Sunday 300,000 or more people ot the working class assembled in St. Petersburg and marched to the emperur's palace to request a hearigg from tríe Czar, but so far from accomplishing rood for themselves it had the + ffect of starting agenuine revolt against the government. The milttary guard around the palace, wnich had been made very strong, was or jered to diaperse the crowd and the ordyt was obeyed, but not witho tine shedding of much innocest blood. The soldiers fired directly into the crowds and reports sav that many were killed outright and thousands were wounded Tbe Czar was in a state of terror and would not see the representatives of the people and his advisors were given a free hand to deal with the strikers. The cutcome is watched with interest by the nations of the world and the belief is indulged that the time is near at hand wh in Russia will ciare to be an absolute monarehy and the laboring people will have an opportunity to become s)mething more than slaves to the aristocracy.
