Capt. Wm. Martin says the hail last Friday ruined half his fruit crops.

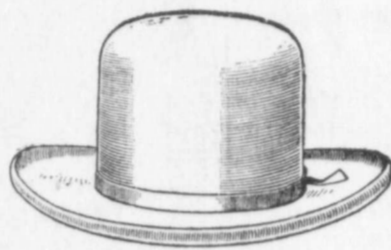
