It is proposed for the legislature to hold a special session at Austin without pay to rectify the mistake made in the general election law. A number of the members of both houses have agreed to serve in the session without compensation.

To save thousands of acres of land in the El Paso valley negotiations have been opened with Mexico for permission to cut a curve in the Rio Grande river seven miles below El Paso, turn the stream into Mexican territory for a short distance, and straighten the channel. This would cut off a few acres of Mexican territory, but would save thousands of acres of Texas land from utter destruction.

A special from Gainesville says that the novel spectacle of whole fields of cotton being plowed up can now be seen in various parts of Cooke county. Whether the farmers agreed to reduce their cotton acreage or not, they will be forced to do so on account of the recent rains, quantities of grass and scarcity of labor.
