One of the largest, if not the argest, thefte from the United States sub-treasury has been unearthed in Chicago. Somewhere between \$175,000 and \$200,000 was stolen from the sub-treasury in that city last

week. James K. Corbett, an actor in the Kennedy Stock company, became suddenly insane on the stage of the Bay City, Mich., theater and shouted for some one in the audience to kill him. The audience at first thought that the actor's actions were part of the play, and other members of the company led him from the stage before the audience became aware of his condition.

Hulen Worbington was shot and instantly killed at Terrell Saturday by City Marshal Woodall. Worbington was being taken to the calaboose by the city marshal on the charge of being intoxicated. When near the calaboose the marshal states that Worbington offered to go home if he would turn him loose. This he did, when Worbington pulled out a knife and, the marehal states, attempted to cut him. It was then the shooting took place. Tae suprems court of the United States Monday affi med with costs the case of the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe railway against the State of Tex s. appealed by the plaintif from the supreme court of Texas. The suit was instituted by the state to recover a penality upon the allegation that the railway company had charged a higher rate than that fixed by the ratiroad commission on car of corn from Texarkana to Goldthwaite. The sole defense was that the shipment was interstate and not subject to the commission. Judgment and penalty of \$100 was adjudged against plaintiff on the finding of the fact that the shipment was entirely within the state.
