FAVOR THE TAX.

The election held here Tuesday to determine whether or not bonds should be issued for \$5000 to build an addition to the public school building resulted in 55 votes being cast favorable to the bond issue, against 8 opposing the proposition. The question of increasing the tax in the school district from 15 cents to 25 cents on the \$100 valuation for incidental purposes was also submitted at this election and resulted in 55 being favorable to the proposition and 9 opposing it. On a basis of last year's valuations in the school district the building tax will amount to \$980.27 and the incidental tax will aggregate \$1895.17. This will enable the board to employ the two extra teachers necessary to supply the new rooms and meet the requirements of the growth of the school.

BOARD MEETING.

The school board met to declare the result of the election and arrange for the issuance of the bonds. It was decided to issue the bonds of \$500 denomination bearing 5 per cent interest, due in forty years, with an option of redeeming any or all of them after five years. The matter was placed in the hands of E. B. Anderson with authority to place the bonds, after having them approved by the attorney general. The board will secure estimates on the building at once and hopes to have it completed in time for the next term of the public school. Miss Ethel Stewart will hereafter receive the Eagle at Purvis, by the order of her relative, Alonso Meyers.
