The diarance from bere to Texss ie great, but not gres to cause me to forget my native land. and while there io 8 vas
differen difference in this oountry snd that, the differenee is suoh as to
make a Texan want to be baok make a Texan want to be baik olime of Texss; especially on thi the 24th of May we are bogking around here in 12 inohes of snow and it looks like now that the dose would be repeated before night.
My brother-in-law, Rev, I Lamb, and I left: Fort Worth on the 30th of April and resobed the Plains that night. At Ams rillo we found the ground cov ered with snow, snd we have no been out of sight of snow since Our trip through New Mexico Colorado and Uish wae gran indeed, the high mountains, deep gorges and long tunnels are to numerous to mention in datail but will try to desoribe faintiy the grand canyon of Colorado we entared this canyon abour $1: 30$ o'clock in the evening and went out abour $80^{\circ}$ clock, mounsin time one hour slower tim than ours. We eatered the gorge at Canyon City, a beauti ful litule oity of perhaps three thousand. It looks to be cles sad a sioe plase to live, it obe wants to be in sight of besutiful grover, in hesring of tumbling wasers snd under the shadow of fertile valley of the Arkanasa river. At thit pisoe the vailey stope and the grand osnyon oommences. The railrosd runs on the right bank of the river and the times near tue water's edge perpendioular for thousand perpendicular for thousande of ing rooks look dane over-hang. road winde its way up the gorge for some fitty miles at one plase. The canyon hasen iron bridge scroes it to oston the falling wrones. Ao we osme through it wae onowing on the routh side and the tun shioing on the north dide, some placere we could an the anow storm raging there; sometimes we would come to a fowe sores of fertile land and there would be a oabin or two apparently oeparated from the life. All heads were hermit windows, but none wared to the his bead out for teser of coming in contaot with over-hanging hocks. Then comes thongiog whiatles trom the engine, but bive know mening ine, bu at once it rould be dask as Egypt; the ladies would eoresm not knowing what had happened oome would laugh and I suppoes the lovers aboard would be kies. ig. but ye saribe contesess the firat time we entered into darik. bess that he was a little eosared. At Balids, a mining town at a wide place in the esnyon, stop was called and twenty minutee given to get supper, but the writer being a little elow failed to reach the counter in time to be served before the time was up to nsove on, but he could oonsole bimseif in knowiog that he was pot the only hungry man on th othere for the train left them a
the counter, but as our train was tourist train running in about ive sections, they boarded the ext train and overtook us at unotion City. Soon night eame on and the grand visions were led down for a night's repose The next day we were in Utab and so huogry we could noten joy the sights until we got break ast, which was at 11 o'olock. At Helper we managed to be on he front ear atepa and well saunted for a run of a half mile to get a 750 breakfast, and we sure won the race and ye soribe and his presoher oompanion got half chicken a piece for our hare besides what other atuff we consumed. Frome here we went up the Spanish Fork; alnost ss fine soenery se the grand anyon. At Soldiers Sumit we were on the highest point that were would reach in Utah. Here we stopped for ten minutes to riew the sighte and for the northorn people to play a game of now ball. but as we were a nuch higher than Texas and our earte thumping like an air pump, we did not indulge lest we hould slip off the mountain top and land in New Mexico or Balt Lake City alone and among trangera. We resohed Balt Lake City at about $3: 30$ o'olock. It ie s besutiful oity, but not as muoh up-to-date ss some of our Texse Ogden to residences. Got int ver until 1 'olocio next morn ing. At 1 o'olock next day we resohed Palsasid, 84 miles from our destination; passed the night here and left the next morning or Eureks on the narrow gage railroad. It took us all day to oome 84 miles; the fare is ten oenta per mile and it has but two depota, one at Palassid and the other at Eureka. We found verything slright and the mines that our uncle left us to be very valuable property. They have yielded thousand of dollars in the past and have only com menced to be worked compared to what they will yet yield, There are three of them, so ye sorib leele a little up in the world a well as ten thousand feet up in ne sir. They are rich in the quality of ore and it gete rioher ine deeper they ko and the
