I will firat take up the amendment ar allowing a salary to will say that from my observa tion snd the best information can get that the 30 th legialature got more than they deserved,
pot more than they deserved, or did. My idea is that no member did. My idea ir that no member hould receive pay for servio not rendered. Bome of the mem bers, no doubt, were in their aeste pretty near every day, but t will venture to say that half of them were oot in their seate two hirds of the time and that one Chird of them not half the time. Consequently the average pay over $\$ 5$ per day $f$ jr the time they aotually served. Everyone who reads the papers know that the whesia of legislation were often ologged on account of a quorum, yet esch member sbsent, though perhaps they were at home sttending to their private business, were drawing their per diem. Ihink the legislative members should have a fixed salary or per diem, snd if absent from sny osuse except sickness, every day they sre absent should bo deducied from their pay. The state should no mors pay for duty not performed thas private individuals or corporations. Suppose Mir. Editor, your ff to mould enough of them lay fffice; soy the work in the Eagle excuse be sbsent one-third the time absent one-third of the month or on regtular pay day present their scoount for full nime, would you pay it? Not not be doing juntioe to your patrons becsuse you could not get out an good paper under such oircumatsnces, If a quorum oculd have been petained every day during the regular seasion
