

Dear Sir: Paint goes by gallon There are useful and useless gallon Useful paint is lead-zine-and-oil with dryer and color; useless paint is whiting, china-clay, ground stone, barytes, benzine, or water.

This stuff is put-in, because it is cheap, to stuff-out the paint, to make more gailons to sell; of course, the buyer doesn't suspect, or he wouldn't buy it.

It costs as much to brush-on this useless stuff as lead-zinc-and-oii; but it looks like that and feels like that in the brush; the painter dosen't suspect it. Beeldes, if the owner is willing, why should the painter object to painting two gallons for one? He is paid by the day; more

gallons, more days, more money. Average paint at full price is about one-third this useless stuff; and average paint at \$1.25 or \$1.60 \$1,75 a gallon is two-thirds trash. Fool paint is the proper name for all but pure paint; it is made to fool people with. Knave paint is another good name; it is made, of course, by knaves. Sick paint is a honest weak paint.
