Poll Tax Payments.

By reference to the road law of Mills county it will be seen that those who fail to pay their poil tax are subject to three days work on the public roads, regardless of whether or ot they are over the road working age. The law makes it the collector's duty to deliver a list of the delinquent poli tax payers to the commissioners on or before March 31 of each year, in order that such delinquents may be summoned to work on the public roads. If they do not care to do this work they will have to pay the poil tax together with costs. Those who have paid their poll tax are requested to pay before the close of March, in order that I may not not be forced to place their names on the list of delinquents.

As I am sending in my Son arrears, will give you a short account of myself since I left Mills

I left Goldthwaite January 25, 1907, with a car load of bees and landed at Uyalde ten days later, thence by wagon I conveyed my bees and belongings eighteen miles to my present location on the Leona river, three miles above Batesville, in Zavalla county.

After getting my bees on their location and opening them up I found them in pretty bad shape, owing to their long confinement in shipping. They had smothered to death by the thousands and I thought I would get very little if any honey from them that year. However, I gave them very careful attention and at the close of the season (the last of June, from 79 hives I had taken pounds of honey, which brought me a little over \$575.00. I had very little swarming in the spring, but after the honey season I practiced artificial swarming and increased my bees to 110 hives, bought 100 more and now have 210 hives, all in one yard.

E. R. Root of Medina, Ohio editor of Gleanings in bee culture, visited this county a few years ago and pronounced this "Bee paradise of Texas" and I think he made no mistake. You may ask from whence the bees gather their honey. Well nearly every thing that grows here is honey producing. At this date, February 28, the bees are gathering honey from the hackberry and Mexican persimmon bloom. Next come the cat claw and waheia about the first of April, and this is where we get our big surplus honey crops, It is claimed that the honey from the cat claw and waheia is the finest in world, and I certainly believe it. Its only fault is that it granulates or turns to sugar in a very short time.

Perhaps some of your readers would like to know something of this county, aside from bee keeping, to such I would say if you expect to farm for a living you had better stay in old Mills




