



If bottled drinks are clear, it is positive evidence that tney are made in a clean shop, and bottled in clean bettles.

Ordinary drinking water, from whatever source it may be derived, from spring, well, lake or running stream, is at certain time of the year contaminated with organic matter of living germs held in solution. > City Ordinance. CHAPTER XXXII.

An ordinance of the city of Goldthwaite, Mills county, Texas, providing for a penalty for any one doctoring sick horses, mules, jacks, cattle, sheep, goats, or any other stock on the streets of the city of Goldthwaite, or for any one to perform any kind of surgical operation, on any of the above named stock, or for any one to work on or pull teeth from the mouth of any of the above named stock, on any of the streets of the city Gold-

ARTICLE NO. I

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Goldthwaite, that it shall hereafter be unlawful for any one to doctor any sick horse, male, jack, cattle, sheep, goat, or other stock upon any of the streets of the city of Goldthwaite, and that it shall be unlawful for any one to perform any kind of surgical operation on any of the above named stock, on the streets of the city of Goldthwaite, or for any one to work on or pull teeth from the mouth of any of the above named stock upon any street in the city of Goldthwaite, or for any one to do or perform any other kind of work on any of the above named stock upon any of the streets of the city of Goldthwaite, that will scatter or cause to catter any foul matter or puss upon any of the streets of the city of Golditwaite, and this ordinance shall inslude any kind of work done, or any kind of treatment done or performed on any of the above named stock, when sick upon any street of the city of Goldthwaite

Any one violating any of the proweigne of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fixed in the sum of \$5.00, and all cost of prosecution and each day shall constitue a separate

Passed, approved and adopted, this the fifth day of July. A. D. 1909, at a regular meeting of the city council, three several times having been unanimously suspended. And it was ordered that this original ordinance making purchase. be filed in the office of the city secretary, and if approved by the Mayor is to be signed by him, and there be kept as charter No. 32, of the ordinances of Goldthwalte.

Which ordinance passed, approved and adopted as aforesaid, was filed with the city secretary, and by me examined and approved and signed, and ordered published, as required by aw, and it was ordered that same be kept by the city secretary.
