Therefore, it will take oon siderable money to pay land owners to set their tonces in and give more right-ofway. The old-time width of 60 teet should certainly be restore for all important road, otherwise it will be impossible to make muoh improvement, as there is believe that most of our land holdert are publio spirited onough to agree to set their tences back at a nominal cort to the county, therefore, the ex pense for that item would probably be amall comparatively, leaving the buik for aotusl work. Now, I sugrest that some in serested parson or pertons get to work at onee and circulate potition asking our honorable oommisaioners court to order sn eleotion for the purpose above aition let ua get the matter prop erly before the people for disous sion.
