The Goldthwaite Eagle Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Authorizing the Establishment of a Home for Wives and Widows of Confederate Soldiers and Sailors

House Joint Reso atton No. 7.
oint Resolution to amend Section 51
of Article 3 of the Constitution of
the State of Texas, as amended in
1903, so as to authorize the grant of
and in the establishment and maintenance of a home for the disabled and dependent wives and widows of Confederate soldiers and saliers and such women as aided he Con-federacy, and making an appropri-

ation.

Be it R solved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:
SECTION 1 That Section 51 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as tollows.

Article 3, Section 51. The Legis-lature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of public money to any individual, associations of individuale, municipal or other corpora-tions whatsoever; provided, however, the Legislature may grant aid to indigent and disabled Confederate soldiers and sailors who came to Texas prior to Jenuary 1, 1880, and who are either over sixty years of age or whose disability is the proximate result of actual service in the Confederate army for a period of proximate result of actual service in the Confederate army for a period of at least three months, their widows in indigent circumstances who have never remarried and have been bona fide residents of the State of Texas since March 1, 1880, and who were married to such soldiers or sailors anterior to March 1, 1880; provided, said aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided father, that eaid aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided futher, that no appropriations shall ever be made for the purpose hereinbefore specified in excess of five hundred thousand dollars for any one year. And also grant aid to the establishment and maintenance of a home for said soldiers and sallors, their wives and widows and women who aided in the Confederacy, under such regulations Confederacy, under such regulations and limitations as may be provided by law; provided, the grant to aid said home shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for any one year, and no inmate of said homes shall be entitled to any other aid from the State; the Legislature may provide for husband and wife to r-main together in the home; and provide futher, that the provisions of this Section shall not be

construed to prevent the grant of aid in case of public calamity.

SEC 2 The Governor of the State SEC 2 The Governor of the State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Texas at the regular election of State officers, in November 1810.

The sum of \$5,000 00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to pay the expenses of carrying out the provisions of this Resolution.

The Goldthwaite Eagle Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Authorizing the Establishment of a Home for Wives and Widows of Confederate Soldiers and Sailors

House Joint Resolution No. 7.

Joint Resolution to amend Section 51 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, so as to authorize the grant of and in the establishment and main-tenance of a home for the disabled and dependent wives and widows of Confederate soldiers and saliors and such women as sided the Confederacy, and making an appropri-

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: SECTION 1 That Section 51 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as

follows:

Article 3, Section 51. The Legislature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of public money to any individuals, associations of individuals, municipal or other corporations whatsoever; provided, however, the Legislature, may grant aid. tions whatsoever; provided, nowever, the Legislature may grant aid to indigent and disabled Confederate soldiers and sailors who came to Texas prior to January 1, 1880, and who are either over sixty years of age or whose disability is the proximate result of actual service in the Confederate army for a period of at least three months, their widows in indigent circumstances who have at least three months, their widows in indigent circumstances who have never remarried and have been bona fide residents of the State of Texas since March 1, 1880, and who were married to such soldiers or sallors anterior to March 1, 1880; provided, said aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided futher, that no appropriations shall ever be made no appropriations shall ever be made for the purpose hereinbefore specified in excess of five hundred thousand dollars for any one year. And also grant aid to the establishment and maintenance of a home for said soldiers and sallors, their wives and widows and women who aided in the Confederacy, under such regulations and filmitations as may be provided by law; provided, the grant to aid said home shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for any one year, and no inmate of for any one year, and no inmate of said homes shall be entitled to any other aid from the State; the Legislature may provide for husband and wife to remain together in the home; and provide futher, that the pro-visions of this Section shall not be construed to prevent the grant of aid

in case of public calamity.

SEC 2 The Governor of the State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Texas at the regular election of State officers, in






