HAMILTON

J. M. Baxley returned Saturday from a business trip to Waco. The city council has about completed arrangements for the installation of a first-class water system in Hamilton. Mr. E. F. Long is here to superintend the work of laying the mains and the erection of the tower on College Hill. The mains are to be eight-inch from to tower to the public square and around the square, and four-inch on the streets leading out in every direction The tank that is to be on the 50-foot tower will hold about 55.000 gallons of water, to be surplied from a well or wells, and pumped into the tank.

Last Thursday afternoon at the big cut on the Comanche extension of the Cotton Belt, about seven miles from Hamilton a most deplorable accident occured that suddenly ended the lives of three men. They were putting 0 in a blast and had filled several boles and were opening another can of powder, when it exploded. There were two men working at it and a young man named Gallas, a son of one of the contractors, was sitting on a keg of powder near by, there being about thirty cane there ready for use in the blast. John Gallas, aged about 20 years, was killed outright and Nick Cox, 35 years old, died within an hour. The other man, Frank Maye, aged 45 years, was badly burned and died during the following night, -Herald.






