The Mills county Baptists met at Big Valley in their annual Association Thursday night, August 8, with good representation from the different churches.

As the number of copies of our minutes that we are able to have published is too small for any general distribution and thinking perhaps that some of our business items might be of interest to the general public, I submit here some extracts from our manuscript.

Among others we would mentnon the report on Ministerial Education. This report delves deep into the vital problem that confronts us of educat ing and fitting our young and worthy preachers who are financially unable to keep themselves in school. The report stresses the importance of a trained ministry and reports more than 500 preachers in Baptist schools during the past year, many of whom are unable to bear their personal expenses. At Baylor and the Seminary \$5,500 was spent on 75 worthy men. After a stirring address by L. R. Scarborough a small offering of \$15.85 was made toward the support of these young men.






