

The farmer may borrow\$200 on one year's time for cultivation, harvesting and the purchasing of seed, manures and fungicides; and Italy enjoyed better markets for \$600 on three year's time for the acquisition of farm machinery.

This completes the three types of rural banks of Italy, one the rural bank which is usually of the Raiffeissen type, the other the people's bank of both the cities and rural districts, known as the Schulze-Delitsch tinuous upbuilding of the soils. This type, and the state bank which loans money to these small banks on the paper of their members.

Perhaps I should explain that the Raiffeissen bank is merely a number of farmers who associate themselves together as a credit society without material capital, and borrow as a society from its respective members, while the Schulze-Delitsch bank is a share bank with limited liability and has capital. Usually the shares are small in amount, about \$3.00. Both these banks receive savings and other deposits of members and nonmembers, to whom they pay about 4 per cent. After a short time these deposits are usually sufficient to supply all the funds required by the bank for lending to its members

Besides these banks are the land credit banks of Italy, which I shall describe at another time, and perhaps I shall not devote an article to them as all institutions are conducted on much the same principles and quite simple in plane and operations. S. A. LINDSEY, Chairman.




