

FERGUSON SPEAKS.

A Good Crowd and Respectful Attention for the Speaker.

Hon, James E. Ferguson of Temple spoke on the court house lawn in this city Monday evening in the interest of his candidacy for the Democratic nomination for governor.

Mr. Ferguson was met at the depot by some of his loyal supporters who had also secured the band for the occasion and he was given a cordial reception and escorted to the place prepared for the speaking, where lie was introduced by Capt. D. T. Bush, chairman of the Ferguson club of this place. There was r large audience present to hear him and he was given close and respectful attention. The audience was made up largely of town people, as the farmers are too busy at this time to give much attention to

political speakers. In his talk Mr. Ferguson discussed pretty much the same subjects as in his other speeches, one of which was published in this paper a few weeks ago.
