It is a rather poor commentary on the sagacity, foresight and manage-

ment of a farmer to sit with him in his home and look out across his field or garden and see a plow, cultivator, reaper, or even threshing machine standing out in the weatheroreble, but there is no assurance of hundreds, perhaps thousands of dol. lars worth of machinery being

damaged materially for no other reason than that its owner simply left it that the bankers will give much as. right where he used it last; and sistance in making the warehouse this is no uncommon sight.
