CONDITION OF CROPS

The state of the s

Small Grain Good-Corn Growing Fine-Cotton Doing Well.

The crop conditions in Mills county are decidedly satisfactory to every. body and the outlook is encouraging from every standpoint.

Small grain, especially oats, made a very fine crop this year. Most of the small grain has already been harvested and while little of the threshing has been done, it is well known that the yield will be exceed. ing good. The acreage allowed to small grain was unusually large in the county, owing to the determination of many farmers to reduce their cotton acreage materially. The oat crop is perhaps the best money crop grown in this county, for there is so little expense attached to the growing and harvesting of the crop. Corn is looking fine and growing

nicely. It has not suffered for rain and there has been plenty of mois. ture in the ground all the time, but the rains this week have been beneficial and will go a long way toward maturing the crop. There is a great. er acreage of corn in the county than there has been for a good many years and a full crop will cause a great deal of corn to be placed on the market, as most farmers will make much more than they will need for their own use.

Cotton is late, but is growing nicethere is no interference by insects ly and will make a good crop if and it gets the later rains. The acreage has been materially decreased in this county and very few farmers have put as much ground to cotton as they have been giving to that erep in former years. With a full yield there will be a considerable cotton crop, but not nearly so much as has been grown in the county.



WATER WORKS PROPOSED

A System to Be Built In the Near Future If the Tax Payers Approve.

A representative of a company whose business it is to supervise the was here this week to confer with the city officials relative to planning a system for this city. His plan outlined is certainly acceptable to the people for there is no expense unless the system is put in and then the firm managing the affairs and super. vising the construction will only receive a per cent of the cost.

The city council has contracted with the firm to make an estimate of the cost of a system of water works to be supplied by wells and also prepare a profile showing where the mains are to run. It is proposed to install a system to supply water for domestic purposes as welll as for fire protection and it is believed the cost will not be greater than the citizens will approve

After the estimate has been made and other necessary data secured it is likely a proposition will be submitted to the citizens to ascertain whether or not they will approve a bond issue of something like \$20,000 or \$25,000 to secure the water works system. Full details will be given showing the cost of installing and operating the system, the reduction of insurance rates, the supply of water to be secured and other matters of interest. This information is awaited with interest and it is expected it will be furnished in the next few weeks. A representative of the supervising company will likely come here in the next week to make a survey and ascertain the flow of wells and other facts. As soon as his estimate is completed it will be given to the public.





CITY ORDINANCE

SUN SHINE.

An Ordinance forbidding spitting on sidewalks, and other public places, and also providing the mode or manner of sweeping sidewalks.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas: Section 1. That it shall hereafter e unlawful for any person to expectorate or spit mucus or saliva, or saliva mixed with tobacco or any other substance, or blow secretions from the nose, or to throw the remains of any chewed or partly chewed tobacco or snuff, or the remains of any partially chewed or smoked cigar or cigarette, upon any sidewalk, public vehicle, depot floors or walls, depot platform, or upon the floors of any public building or resort within the city of Goldthwaite, Texas.

Section 2. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to sweep or brush the dirt or trash from any sidewalk in this city without first sprinkling the sidewalk either with water, floor sweep or some other substance that will settle and keep down the dust.

Penalty: Any person violating any section of this ordinance shall be upon conviction therefor shall be fined in any sum not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$25.00.







Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas: Section 1. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to expectorate or spit mucus or saliva, or saliva mixed with tobacco or any other substance, or blow secretions from the nose, or to throw the remains of any chewed or partly chewed tobacco or snuff, or the remains of any partially chewed or smoked cigar or cigarette, upon any sidewalk, public vehicle, depot floors or walls, depot platform, or upon the floors of any public building or resort with-

in the city of Goldthwaite, Texas. Section 2. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to sweep or brush the dirt or trash from any sidewalk in this city without first sprinkling the sidewalk either with water, floor sweep or some other substance that will settle and keep down the dust.




