



PROSPECTS FOR CROPS

The fact that the southwest instead of depending upon cotton for a money crop, has produced large crops of wheat and oats; has excellent prospects for corn, cotton, milo, feterita, sudan, etc., means more to the prosperity of our people than nany realize. Nor is this all: We have prospects for the largest yield of peaches for several years. Early beaches are now being marketed and only a few weeks remain til Mamie Ross and Elberta will te on he market. Truck crops and berries have yielded well and livestock are i excellent condition.

It has beene pointed out that the acreage of cotton has been reduced omsiderably, and the encouraging eature is that the reduced cotton icreage has been planted in food and feed crops. 




