





The average farmer works too hard and fails to take enough rest and recreation. It may and often ices happen that in certain seasons such as winter, when he is not pressed with work, little may be done. But this is exceptional, as there is generally work in repairing, making improvements and other work not directly connected with cultivating the soil. Hence there is too great demand made upon the physical strength and endurance of the farmer and his

At the factory everything that can is satisfied if it takes some time for it to pay for itself in the cost of

This is suggestive to managers of farms. It is not at all necessary for an implement or machine to pay for itself in one or even two or three years, yet many of them will. The object should be to save labor, which is profit after the machine or imple-

There is, of course, one advantage the manufacturer has over the farmer: the manufacturer can usually borrow capital, if he hasn't it, at a very low rate of interest, while the farmer must pay a high rate if he is able to borrow at all. But conditions that handicap the farmer in sccuring the capital must change. When cash buying is the rule and when the farm is made to yield sufficient cash to permit deposits at the banks, then will credit be more easily and cheaply obtained and the farmer may secure credit upon satisfactory terms.

Most manufacturers find it more profitable to work no more than eight hours per day. More than this number of hours per day is illegal 'n many states because it has been Special on JNO. B.
